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I Corinthians

I. The Corinthians are greeted by Paul - 1:1-9

A. Paul gave greetings to the church at Corinth - 1:1-3

1. these greetings were from Paul and Sosthenes - 1:1

Paul was the writer of the book - I Cor. 1:1 Paul was called to be an apostle of Jesus Christ - Romans 1:1 Paul received this call through the will of God - II Cor. 1:1

Sosthenes was a brother in Christ - I Cor. 1:1 Sosthenes had been the ruler of the synagogue in Corinth - Acts 18:17

2. these greetings were to the church at Corinth - 1:2

the church at Corinth was started by Paul - Acts 18:1 the church at Corinth began in the home of Aquila - Acts 18:2-3 the church at Corinth contained both Jews and Gentiles - Acts 18:4-8 the church at Corinth had daily teaching for 18 months - Acts 18:9-11 the church at Corinth was rejected by many Jews - Acts 18:12-17 the church at Corinth received further teaching - Acts 18:18 the church at Corinth was strengthened by Apollos - Acts 18:27-28

this church was the church of God at Corinth
this church was sanctified in Christ Jesus
this church was called to be saints
(they were saints even though every chapter has problems)
this church included all in Corinth who called on Christ

3. these greetings focused on grace and peace - 1:3

grace speaks of good will, loving-kindness or favor peace speaks of the inner peace in a Christian

this peace is from both the Father and from our Lord Jesus Christ this peace is the result of our assurance of salvation in Christ this peace is the result of having no fear of judgment from God this peace makes it possible to accept our present situation

B. Paul expressed thanks for the church at Corinth - 1:4-9

1. this thanks was expressed continually - 1:4

Paul continually expressed thanks to God for the Corinthians Paul continually thanks God for the grace He had shown to them

2. this thanks was for all that Christ had done for them - 1:5

all believers are enriched by Christ in this present age as a result:

all believers are able to speak for God all believers have been given knowledge to speak

3. this thanks was for the work Christ had done in their lives - 1:6

Christ was working in their lives to confirm their salvation (this was true in spite of all the problems of this church)

4. this thanks was for the fact that they had received all the gifts - 1:7


all Christians have received spiritual gifts regardless of their maturity all Christians have received spiritual gifts to edify one another all Christians are to use our gifts as we wait for the Lord to come

5. this thanks was for the fact that Christ would make them blameless - 1:8

Christ will continue to strengthen us unto the end Christ will present us blameless at His coming

6. this thanks was for the fact that God is faithful - 1:9

God is faithful and will not change His grace toward us God is the One who has called us for all eternity God has called us to enjoy fellowship with Christ



- II. The Corinthians are taught how to deal with divisions
- A. divisions were present in the church at Corinth 1:10-17
 - 1. the Corinthians had divisions among them 1:10-11
 - a. division results in not speaking the same things 1:10

Paul begged them to speak the same things

unity in the body is the result of seeking spiritual wisdom - I Cor. 2:9-13 **Paul begged them to avoid divisions**

unity in the body is the result of growing spiritual maturity - I Cor. 3:1-3

Paul begged them to heal the divisions and have unity

unity in the body is the result of building on a firm foundation - I Cor. 3:10-17

Paul begged them to have the same mind
this happens as we conform our minds to Christ and His Word
Paul begged them to have the same judgment
this happens as we make decisions as a body based on His Word

b. division will always cause strife in a local church - 1:11

Paul told how he had learned about what was happening Paul told that he had heard that there was strife among them

- 2. the Corinthians were choosing favorite teachers 1:12-17
- a. Paul said some were choosing a particular teacher 1:12

some claimed to follow Paul some claimed to follow Apollos some claimed to follow Peter some claimed to follow Christ

when there are divisions, most are usually following their own will

b. Paul said that Christ is not divided - 1:13

Christ is the source of unity not division Paul did not die for them on the cross Paul did not baptize them in his own name

c. Paul said that he had baptized very few - 1:14

Paul seldom did the baptizing
Paul had baptized Crispus
(Crispus had been the chief ruler of the synagogue - Acts 18:8)
he had been one of the first Christians in Corinth
Paul had baptized Gaius
(Gaius was the person with whom Paul stayed on a later visit - Rom. 16:23)
he had probably been one of the first Christians in Corinth

d. Paul said he did not want any to say they were baptized in his name - 1:15

there is always a danger of individuals becoming people followers (Paul did not want people to become followers of him)

e. Paul named a few others he had baptized - 1:16

Paul had also baptized the household of Stephanas
Stephanas had been one of the first to become a Christian in Corinth - I Cor. 16:15
Stephanas had come to visit Paul in the city of Ephesus - I Cor. 16:17
Stephanas was one of the ones who brought this letter to Corinth

f. Paul gives us an important example here

Paul only baptized the first few converts since he was the church planter

Paul had other converts baptized by the initial converts to focus on unity in the body Christ used this same pattern - John 4:1-2

g. Paul said he came to preach the cross of Christ - 1:17

Christ did not send Paul to baptize Christ sent Paul to preach

Paul was to preach the Gospel
Paul was to avoid depending on human wisdom
Paul was to avoid anything that took away from the cross of Christ
(we are not to let ourselves hinder the message of Christ)

- B. divisions were caused by a lack of maturity 1:18-2:16
- 1. they did not understand the message of the cross 1:18-2:5
 - a. the cross was a stumbling block to many 1:18-25
 - 1) the message of the cross has the power of God 1:18

The message of the cross produces two different responses:

It is foolishness to those who are perishing

God says that the cross is foolishness to the Gentiles - I Cor. 1:23

God has chosen the foolish things to confound the wise - I Cor. 1:27

It is the power of God to us who are being saved

Gods says that the cross is the power of God to the called - I Cor. 1:24

2) the message of the cross is not based on human wisdom - 1:19

God will destroy the wisdom of the wise
the wisdom of this world is earthly, sensual, demonic - James 3:15-16
the wisdom from above is pure and peaceable- James 3:17-18
God will bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent
the thoughts of God are hidden from the prudent - Matt. 11:25
the thoughts of God are revealed to spiritual babes - Luke 10:21

3) the message of the cross makes human wisdom look foolish - 1:20

God silences the wise, the scribe and the disputer we are not to be wise in our own conceits - Rom. 12:16 we are to seek the mind of Christ - Phil. 2:5-8
God makes foolish the wisdom of this world worldly wisdom focuses on the external - Col. 2:20-23 true wisdom shows itself by godly character - James 3:13

4) the message of the cross is the message that saves those who believe - 1:21

the world cannot know God from the wisdom of the world
the wisdom of this world darkens the foolish heart - Rom. 1:20-23
the world will only know God through the foolishness of preaching
the preaching of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing - I Cor. 1:18
the preaching of the cross is done in the power of the Spirit - I Cor. 2:2-5

5) the message of the cross rejects human standards - 1:22

the Jews require a sign

the scribes and Pharisees asked for a sign - Matt 12:38-40; Matt. 16:1

the Greeks seek after wisdom

the Greeks trusted in human wisdom - Acts 17:18-21

6) the message of the cross causes many to stumble - 1:23

the message of the cross was the message of the apostles
the message of the cross was to be preached to all nations - Luke 24:46-48
the message of the cross was the message of Paul - Gal. 6:14
the message of the cross is to be our message also - II Cor. 4:5
the message of the cross was a stumbling block to the Jews
the message of the cross was preached to the Jews - Acts 2:22-36
the message of the cross caused the Jews to stumble - Rom. 9:37-39
the message of the cross was foolishness to the Greeks
the message of the cross was preached to the Gentiles - Acts 10:39-43
the message of the cross is foolishness to all unbelievers - I Cor. 2:14

7) the message of the cross shows both the power and wisdom of God - 1:24

the message of the cross is recognized by those who are called
the called include all believers - I Cor. 1:9
the called are called by the purpose of God - Rom. 8:28-30
the message of the cross is for both Jews and Greeks
the called include both Jews and Gentiles - Rom. 9:24
the message of the cross demonstrates the power of God
the message of the Gospel is the power of God - Rom. 1:16
the message of the cross demonstrates the wisdom of God
Christ became wisdom for us from God - I Cor. 1:30

8) the message of the cross confounds the wisdom and strength of men - 1:25

the foolishness of God is wiser then men

the wisdom of God is beyond human understanding - Rom. 11:33-36 the wisdom of God is the message that we speak - I Cor. 2:7

the weakness of God is stronger than men
the strength of God is revealed through the Spirit - Zech. 4:6-7

b. the cross does not depend on human wisdom - 1:26-31

1) God has not called many who depend on self - 1:26

God is the One who calls all who have come to Christ
the Father is the One who calls all who come to Christ - John 6:37
God does not call many who depend on human wisdom
the message did not come to them in human wisdom - I Cor. 2:3-6
the message compared spiritual things with spiritual - I Cor. 2:13
the message came in the wisdom of God - I Cor. 3:18-20
the message is revealed to man by God - Matt. 11:25-26
the message is revealed to those who seek godly wisdom - James 3:13-17
God does not call many who depend on human power
the message was not received by the religious leaders - John 7:47-49
the message was not received by the political leaders - John 18:38
God does not call many who depend on human position
the message was not received by those who depend on wealth - Luke 18:24-25

2) God has called the foolish and the weak - 1:27

God is the One who calls the foolish

this call is to those who become a fool to the world - I Cor. 3:18 this call is to those become fools for Christ - II Cor. 12:11

God is the One who calls the weak

this call is to those who are just children - Matt. 21:16

3) God has called those who are rejected - 1:28

God is the One who calls those born to a low position
this call is to those who are not accepted by others - Luke 4:18-19
this call is to those who are poor - Matt. 11:4-5
God is the One who calls the rejected
this call is to those rejected by society - Matt. 10:9-13
this call is to those rejected because of ethnicity - John 4:39-42
this call is to those rejected because of sin- John 8:1-11

"All that the Father gives Me will come to Me, and the one who comes to Me I will by no means cast out." John 6:37

4) God has called us without human glory - 1:29

we have no basis for human glory we are to glory in the Lord - I Cor. 1:31 we have received all that we have from the Lord - I Cor. 4:7 we see that we are not to glory in man - I Cor. 5:6 we will not have glory in the presence of God we are all guilty before God - Rom. 3:19 we have no basis for boasting - Rom. 3:27 we see Abraham had no basis for boasting - Rom. 4:2 we are to glory in Christ not self - Rom. 15:17 we have no works in which we can boast - Eph. 2:9 the Father has given all glory to Christ - Phil. 2:9-11

5) God has made us what we are in Christ - 1:30

Christ has placed us in His body

we were all baptized into His body - I Cor. 12:12-13 we have all become members of His body - I Cor. 12:18 we are particular members of the body of Christ - I Cor. 12:27 we are all to abide in Christ - John 15:1-6 we are to be one in Christ - John 17:21-23 Christ has given us wisdom from God we are given the wisdom of God - I Cor. 1:24 we are to pray for wisdom - Eph. 1:17-18 we have had the wisdom of God revealed to us - Eph. 3:9-10 we see that Christ is the source of all wisdom - Col. 2:2-3 Christ has given us righteousness we have been given the righteousness of Christ - II Cor. 5:21

Christ has given us sanctification we have been sanctified regardless of our past - I Cor. 6:9-11

Christ has given us redemption

we have received redemption through Christ - Eph. 1:7

6) God has made us to give all glory to Christ - 1:31

we are to give glory we are to glory in the Lord - II Cor. 10:17 we are to give all glory to Christ we are to boast in the cross of Christ - Gal. 6:13-14

c. the cross was the message Paul preached - 2:1-5

1) Paul did not preach with human wisdom - 2:1

Paul did not depend on human speech

Paul reasoned from the Word of God - Acts 18:1-4

Paul did not depend on human wisdom

Paul did not depend on his speaking ability - I Cor. 2:4

Paul did declare the testimony of God

Paul said his message was repentance and faith - Acts 20:21

2) Paul preached Christ and Him crucified - 2:2

Paul chose to preach only about Christ

Paul knew that it is Christ that changes lives - I Cor. 1:23

Paul chose to focus on the crucifixion

Paul knew that the cross is the power of God in action - I Cor. 1:18

3) Paul preached in weakness and fear - 2:3

Paul experienced weakness

Paul knew God's strength would be revealed through his weakness - II Cor. 12:5-10

Paul experienced fear

Paul had to deal both with conflicts and fears - II Cor. 7:5

Paul experienced much trembling

Paul had to learn to depend on Christ - II Cor. 4:8-10

4) Paul preached in the power of the Spirit - 2:4

Paul did not speak with enticing words

Paul chose to declare the whole counsel of God - Acts 20:27

Paul did not speak with human wisdom

Paul said flattering speech is for those who try to deceive - Rom. 16:18

Paul spoke in the power of the Spirit

Paul spoke in the power of the Spirit - I Cor. 2:14-16

5) Paul preached so their faith would be in the power of God - 2:5

Paul did not want faith based on the wisdom of men - I Cor. 1:17 Paul wanted faith based on the power of God - Rom. 1:16

- 2. they did not understand the ministry of the Spirit 2:6-16
 - a. spiritual wisdom is a mystery to the world 2:6-8
- 1) the wisdom of God is different than the wisdom of the world 2:6

the wisdom that Paul spoke was a perfect wisdom

the thoughts and ways of God are higher than our thoughts and ways - Is. 55:8-9 the wisdom of God is the result of growing to maturity - Eph. 4:11-13 the wisdom of God is more than we yet understand - Phil 3:12-15 the wisdom that Paul spoke was not the wisdom of this age the wisdom that Paul shared was spiritual wisdom - I Cor. 2:13 the wisdom of God is different than the wisdom of men - James 3:13-17 the wisdom of the rulers was against Christ - Acts 4:25-28 Paul did not depend on the wisdom of man - I Cor. 2:1 the wisdom of this world produces spiritual death - Eph 2:1-4

2) the wisdom of God has been a mystery to the world - 2:7

the wisdom of God is a mystery

this wisdom has been a mystery to the world - Eph. 3:3-7
this wisdom has been revealed to the saints - Col. 1:26-27
the wisdom of God has been hidden from the world
this wisdom was not even revealed to the Old Testament saints - I Pet. 1:11-12
the wisdom of God was present before the world began
this wisdom was a part of the plan of God from eternity - II Tim. 1:9
this wisdom will bring us to glory - II Pet. 1:3-4

3) the wisdom of God has been rejected by the worldly rulers - 2:8

the rulers of this world did not know the wisdom of God

God has revealed these things to the foolish and the weak - I Cor. 1:26-29
God has revealed these things to those who are babes - Matt. 11:25-26
God did not reveal these things to the religious leaders - John 7:48
the rulers of this world crucified Christ because they lacked godly wisdom
the rulers crucified Christ in ignorance - Acts 3:17
the rulers did not recognize Christ from the Scriptures - Acts 13:27
the rulers had their minds blinded - II Cor. 3:14
even Paul had rejected Christ in his ignorance - I Tim. 1:13

b. spiritual wisdom is revealed by the Spirit - 2:9-12

1) the Spirit has many things to teach us - 2:9

we have not yet seen what God has prepared for us
these things were given by people who did not understand - I Pet. 1:12
we have not yet heard what God has prepared for us
these things will result in a reward for us - James 1:12
we have not yet understood what God has prepared for us
these things are all going to work out for our good - Rom. 8:28-29

2) the Spirit reveals the things of God to us - 2:10

God says the Spirit is the One who reveals the things of God
the Spirit reveals things as we pray and seek the will of God - Rom. 8:26-27
God says that the Spirit searches all things
the Spirit is the One who teaches us all things - John 14:26; 16:13
God says that the Spirit searches the deep things of God
the Spirit searches the things beyond our understanding - Rom. 11:33-36

3) the Spirit of God knows our inner spirit - 2:11

man does not know the thoughts of another man
a man cannot know the thoughts of another - Prov. 14:10
man only knows his own thoughts through his spirit
a man can only know by drawing out the thoughts of another - Prov. 20:5
man does not know the things of God but by the Spirit
a man cannot know the things of God without the Spirit - Rom. 11:33-35

4) the Spirit of God is the Spirit we have received - 2:12

we did not receive the spirit of the world
the spirit of this age blinds the minds of people - II Cor. 4:4
the spirit of this world controls the thinking of people - I John 5:19
we have received the Spirit of God
the Spirit in us is greater than the spirit of the world - I John 4:4
the Spirit we have received is the Spirit of God - Rom. 8:15-16
we are able to know the things of God by that Spirit
the Spirit of truth reveals all truth to us - John 16:13-15
the Spirit of truth testifies of Christ - John 15:26-27

c. spiritual wisdom is revealed through the Word - 2:13

we do not teach the wisdom of men
we will only be effective as we teach in the power of God - I Cor. 2:4
we do not follow the fables of man - II Pet. 1:16
we teach the wisdom revealed by the Spirit
the Spirit teaches us what we ought to say - Luke 12:12
we teach the wisdom that compares spiritual with spiritual
this wisdom comes from the Word of God - Col. 3:16

- d. spiritual wisdom is really the mind of Christ 2:14-16
- 1) this wisdom is not revealed to the natural man 2:14

the natural man does not understand the things of the Spirit
the natural man does not seek wisdom from above - James 3:14-16
the natural man is blinded by the god of this age - II Cor. 4:4
the natural man views spiritual things as foolishness
the natural man teaches according to his own lusts - Jude 18-19
the natural man cannot have spiritual discernment
the natural man can hear but not understand - Matt. 13:13

2) this wisdom is revealed to the spiritual man - 2:15

the spiritual man examines all things
the spiritual man is able to restore others - Gal. 6:1
the spiritual man prays for spiritual understanding - Col. 1:9
the spiritual man cannot be rightly judged by others
the false brethren could not understand Christian liberty - Gal. 2:3-5
the untaught brethren will try to add the law to liberty - Acts 15:1-5

3) this wisdom only comes from the Lord - 2:16

we do not have the mind to instruct Christ Job was asked if he could correct god - Job 40:2 the Spirit of God is not instructed by man - Is. 40:13-14

we have been given the mind of Christ

Christ has shared His plans with us - John 15:15
the Holy Spirit reveals the mind of the Father to us - John 16:13-15
Christ shared the word of the Father with us - John 17:6-8

- C. divisions were causing serious consequences 3:1-23
- 1. the Corinthians were carnal because of immaturity 3:1-3
 - a. the Corinthians had remained as spiritual toddlers 3:1

they had not become spiritual men

the Corinthians were still controlled by sin - Gal. 6:1 the Corinthians could not yet grasp true wisdom - I Cor. 2:6 the Corinthians were not yet able to judge all things - I Cor. 2:15

they had remained like fleshly men

they were walking like men of the flesh - I Cor. 3:3 they were depending on their own strength - Rom. 7:15-25 they were deceiving themselves with human wisdom - I Cor. 3:18-19

they had remained as spiritual toddlers

a toddler has not put away childish things - I Cor. 13:11 a toddler is still easily deceived by false teachers - Eph. 4:14 a toddler has not matured properly - Heb. 5:11-14

b. the Corinthians still needed a diet of milk - 3:2

they had received the milk of the Word
the one who still needs milk is unskillful in the Word - Heb. 5:13
they had not received more in depth teaching
they had not matured enough to understand - Heb. 5:14
they were not prepared for the more in depth teaching
they were still controlled by divisions - I Cor. 1:10
they were not prepared for teaching about spiritual things - I Cor. 12:1

c. the Corinthians still acted like non-Christians - 3:3

they were still acting like men of the flesh
they needed to put off the things of the flesh - Col. 3:5-8
they were still having various conflicts
they had not yet learned to walk in the Spirit - Gal. 5:16
they were still walking in pride - I Cor. 4:18
they were still walking like people without Christ
(there are major problems in every chapter of I Corinthians)
this is true of all who remain as spiritual toddlers
I Cor. 3:1-3; I Cor. 13:11; Eph. 4:14; Heb. 5:11-14

2. the Corinthians needed to recognize laborers as equal - 3:4-9

a. our leaders are not the ones who changed us - 3:4

people were claiming to be of Paul and others of Apollos we are not to be followers of favorite leaders - I Cor. 1:12; 4:6

people were showing that they were fleshly
we are not to think the way that the world thinks - Rom. 12:2

b. our leaders are to be those who serve - 3:5

Paul and Apollos were servants who had led others to Christ
Paul and Apollos were servants of Christ and stewards of God - I Cor. 4:1-2
Paul and Apollos were serving as the Lord worked in each one
the Lord is the One who gives all gifts for ministry - Rom. 12:3-8; I Pet. 4:10

c. our leaders are to work together in ministry - 3:6

leaders work together to do the work of the Lord - Acts 14:27 leaders look to the Lord to give the increase the Lord is the One who produces the harvest - Mark 4:26-29

d. our leaders are to look to God for the increase - 3:7

the workers are not the focus - II Cor. 12:9-10; Gal. 6:3 the Lord is the One who is the focus - Rom. 15:5-7

e. our leaders will receive their reward from Christ - 3:8

leaders work together as a team

different people function in different parts of the work - John 4:36-38 leaders will each be rewarded by the Lord different people will each be rewarded individually - I Cor. 3:12-16

f. our leaders are all laborers together with God - 3:9

We have all been created in Christ for good works - Eph. 2:10

God is the One who produces results

God is the Lord of the harvest - Matt. 9:38

3. the Corinthians had to build on the right foundation - 3:10-17

God is the One who allows us to build on the foundation - 3:10

Paul was called to be a masterbuilder by God

Paul did what he did by the grace of God - I Cor. 15:10 Paul was called to preach where others had not yet preached - Rom. 15:20

Paul was called to lay a foundation in many places

Paul had planted churches from Jerusalem to Illyricum - Rom. 15:19

Paul said that others would build on that foundation

Paul sent Timothy to build on that foundation - I Cor. 4:14-17
Paul sent Titus to build on that foundation - Titus 1:5
Paul said the whole church would be built on that foundation - Eph. 2:19-22

God says Christ is the true foundation - 3:11

The true foundation is not laid by man

the true foundation was laid by the Father - I Pet. 2:6-8 the solid foundation laid by God will stand - II Tim. 2:19

The true foundation is Christ, Himself

Christ is the chief cornerstone - Acts 4:11-12 Christ says no other gospel is to be preached - Gal. 1:7-9

God says we build on that foundation with various materials - 3:12

Some will build with gold, silver and precious stones

when we have a genuine faith, it is more precious than gold - I Pet. 1:7 when we teach good doctrine we are building with gold - I Tim. 4:6

Some will build with wood, hay and stubble

when we build with the wrong materials, it produces dishonor - II Tim. 2:20 when we just peddle the Word, we are like wood - II Cor. 2:17 when we handle the Word deceitfully, we are like wood - II Cor. 4:2

God says our works will be tested by fire - 3:13

Our works will be revealed

our works are to be done in the power of the Holy Spirit - I Thess. 1:5

Our works will be tested by fire

our works will have their true character revealed by God - I Cor. 4:5 our works may be tested by suffering - I Pet. 4:12

God says those whose work abides will receive a reward - 3:14

the Lord will test our works to see what abides
we will stand before God to see what abides - II Cor. 5:10-11
the Lord will reward our works that abide
we will have joy in the presence of the Lord - I Thess. 2:19
we will receive the reward of the faithful - II Tim. 4:7-8
we will share in the glory of heaven - I Pet. 5:1

God says those whose work is burned have no reward - 3:15

the Lord says that some works will be burned
our works will be tested by fire - I Cor 3:13
the Lord says this will result in loss of reward
we want to receive a full reward - II John 8
the Lord says it will not result in loss of salvation
the righteous will be saved in the judgment day - I Pet. 4:18

God says that we are the temple of God - 3:16

we are the temple of God

we are the temple of the living God - II Cor. 6:16
we are being built together in the temple of God - Eph. 2:21-22
we are the house of Christ - Heb. 3:6
we are a spiritual house - I Pet. 2:5
we have the Spirit of God dwelling in us

we were promised that the Spirit would dwell in us - John 14:17 we have the Spirit dwelling in us and giving us life - Rom. 8:11 we have been given the Spirit to dwell in us - I John 4:12-16

God says that we as His temple are holy - 3:17

we are not to defile the temple of God

we are not to defile the temple with sin - I Cor. 6:13-18

we will be judged if we defile the temple of God

we will have our body judged if we continue to defile it - I Cor. 5:5 we will have our body judged if we do not examine ourselves - I Cor. 11:28-32

we are to preserve the temple of God as a holy temple

we are to glorify God in our body and in our spirit - I Cor. 6:19-20 we are to keep our temple as a clean and holy temple - II Cor. 6:14-18

4. the Corinthians could not depend on human wisdom - 3:18-23

human wisdom can deceive - 3:18

people can deceive themselves and seek another foundation
the only true foundation is Christ - I Cor. 3:10
people who do this are trying to be wise in this age

a husband is to meet the need of the wife for affection husbands are to give honor to the wife - I Pet. 3:7 a wife is to meet the need of the husband for affection partners are both to meet the needs of one another - I Pet.3:8-9

knowledge is limited in this life - 8:2

people may think that they know a lot

those who are proud actually know nothing - I Tim. 6:3-5

people will realize that they actually know very little yet
those without love do not understand what they are saying - I Tim. 1:5-7

people will one day have a full knowledge

we will one day know as we are known by God - I Cor. 13:12

there are both many gods and many lords there are many gods that people serve - Gal. 4:8

there is only one true God

the true God is the Creator - Jonah 1:9

the true God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit dwelling together - John 14:9-10

this food was received while they were under the cloud - 10:2

Paul said they were all baptized into Moses in the cloud God caused the people to see that Moses was faithful - Heb. 3:2-3 Paul said they were all baptized into Moses in the sea God caused the people to see His work and believe Moses - Ex. 14:31

this food was the spiritual food which was given to all - 10:3

Paul said they all ate the same spiritual food

some put God to the test by fornication - 10:8

Paul said that some of them committed sexual immorality
Paul said that 23,000 died as a result in one day
this happened in the land of Moab - Numbers 25:1-9 (less 1000 in v. 4)

some put God to the test and were destroyed by serpents - 10:9

Paul said that when we sin we test Christ
Paul said some were destroyed by serpents for testing Christ
this happened as they went around Edom - Num. 21:4-9

some put God to the test by murmuring - 10:10

Paul said some put God to the test by murmuring Paul said that those who murmured were destroyed this happened often in the wilderness - Ex. 15:24, Num. 14:27-30

d. Israel provides an example for us to escape sin - 10:11-13

God gave us example for our admonition - 10:11

Paul said that these things were for our example

God calls us to be wise - 10:15

Paul said he was speaking to wise men
Paul says we are to be mature in our understanding - I Cor. 14:20

Paul told them to judge what he was saying Paul says we are to test all things - I Thess. 5:21-22

b. we are to avoid fellowship with demons - 10:16-20

God reminds us that the cup reminds us of the blood of Christ - 10:16

Paul said we have a cup of blessing that we bless
the cup is used to refer to our communion - I Cor. 11:23-29
Paul said that cup represents the blood of Christ
the cup represents the blood of the new covenant - Matt. 26:27-29
Paul said that we have bread that we break
the bread represents the body of Christ - I Cor. 11:23-24
Paul said that bread is the communion of the body of Christ
the breaking of bread is a part of our fellowship - Acts 2:42, 46

God reminds us that we are all partakers of Christ's body - 10:17

Paul said that many become one body in communion

we have many members but one body - I Cor. 12:12, 27 we have all become part of that one body - Gal. 3:26-28

Paul said that we all share the same bread

we see that Christ has made peace so we are one - Eph. 2:15-18 we see that Christ wants us all to come to unity and maturity - Eph. 4:12-13 we see that we are all connected to the Head - Col. 2:19

God reminds us of the example of physical Israel - 10:18

Paul said to look at the example of Israel again
Paul also had a real concern for the physical Israel - Rom. 9:3-8

Paul said those who ate the sacrifices shared the altar
Paul said those who served in the temple shared the sacrifices - I Cor. 9:13

God reminds us that an idol is nothing - 10:19

Paul asked if an idol is really anything
Paul said that an idol is actually nothing - I Cor. 8:4
Paul asked if the sacrifices to idols were anything
Paul realized that not all understood this yet - I Cor. 8:5-7

God reminds us that sacrifices are to demons not just idols - 10:20

Paul said that the Gentiles were actually sacrificing to demons the people had sacrificed to demons in the wilderness - Deut. 32:16-17 the people had sacrificed their children to demons - Psalm 107:37-39 the people will sacrifice to demons in the future - Rev. 9:20

Paul said that we are not to have fellowship with demons the people have been blinded by the god of this age - II Cor. 4:4

c. we are not to provoke the Lord to jealousy - 10:21-22

God reminds us we cannot serve Christ and demons - 10:21

Paul said we cannot drink of both the cup of the Lord and the cup of demons

Christ said that we cannot serve two masters - Matt. 6:24

the cup that we have is the cup of the Lord - I Cor. 10:16

Paul said we cannot eat from the Lord's table and the table of demons

there can be no agreement between the Lord and Satan - II Cor. 6:15-17

to eat in an idol's temple would hurt a weaker Christian - I Cor. 8:9-11

God reminds us that He is a jealous God - 10:22

Paul asked if we are trying to provoke the Lord to jealousy the Lord our God is a jealous God - Ex. 20:5

Paul asked if we think we are stronger than the Lord the Lord says we can do nothing without Him - John 15:5

3. the people were to glorify God in all things - 10:23-11:1

a. we are to seek the benefit of others - 10:23-24

all things are lawful but not all things built up - 10:23

Paul said all things are lawful but not all are helpful the question should be, Are we walking in love? - Rom. 14:14-15

Paul said all things are lawful but all do not build up the Lord calls us to build up others - Rom. 14:19, 15:1-2

all things that we do should be to benefit others - 10:24

Paul said we are not to seek our own benefit
the problem is that most people seek their own benefit -Phil. 2:21
Paul said we are to seek the benefit of others
the solution is for each of us to look for the benefit of others - Phil. 2:4-5

b. we are to eat without asking questions - 10:25-27 the Lord tells us not to ask questions about food - 10:25

Paul said we are to eat whatever is sold in the market

the Lord created the earth and everything on it - 10:26

Paul said the Lord created everything on the earth the earth belongs to the the Lord - Ex. 19:5, Deut. 10:14

the Lord created all foods for us to eat - 10:27

Paul said we can accept invitations to dinner from non-Christians if we desire

Christ gave the example by eating at the house of Levi - Luke 5:28-30

Paul said that we are to eat whatever is served without asking questions

Christ tells us to eat without asking questions - I Cor. 10:25

c. we are not to eat if it would cause stumbling - 10:28-30

God calls us to listen to the weaker brother - 10:28

this information is often given by person who is struggling - I Cor. 8:10-13 this gives us an opportunity to help build the person up - Rom. 14:19

Paul said some may tell us the food was offered to idols this should not cause us to judge his opinions - Rom. 14:1-3 this should cause us to avoid being a stumbling block - Rom. 14:13

Paul said we should not eat for the sake of the one who told us this should guide us in knowing how to walk in love - Rom. 14:15

Paul said we should not eat for the sake of conscience this would defile their weak conscience - I Cor. 8:7

Paul said we realize everything comes from the Lord we need to seek the Lord and His righteousness - Matt. 6:31-33 we are to give thanks to the Lord for what He provides - Rom. 14:6

God calls us to avoid hurting a weaker brother - 10:29

Paul said our conscience is not the problem

Paul said he worked to please men in all things

1. God is the head of all - 11:2-3

Christ gives us commandments to keep - 11:2

Paul praised the Corinthians for remembering him
Paul gave thanks for the church at Corinth - I Cor. 1:4-9
Paul praised the Corinthians for keeping the ordinances
Paul was giving instructions to all of the churches - I Cor. 7:17

Christ is our head and God is His head - 11:3

Paul said that Christ is the head of every man
Christ is the head over all in the church - Eph. 1:22-23
Paul said that man is the head of woman
Christ said that the man is the head of the wife - Eph. 5:22-23
Paul said that God is the head of Christ
Christ also has placed Himself under the Father - I Cor. 15:27-28

2. God made man in His image 11:4-9

Christ said that man is not to pray with his head covered - 11:4

a man who prays with his head covered dishonors his head a man who prophesies with his head cover dishonors his head the passage makes it clear this is talking about the hair - I Cor. 11:14

Christ said that woman is to pray with her head covered - 11:5

a woman who prays or prophesies uncovered dishonors her head a woman who did that would be like one shaved the passage makes it clear this is talking about the hair - I Cor. 11:15

Christ said that it is a shame for women to be shaved - 11:6

a woman who is an uncovered woman is like one shorn a woman is to have a covering

God said that men and women are to be different - Deut. 22:5

Christ said that man is in the image of God - 11:7

a man is the image and glory of God
God created man in His image - Gen. 1:26-27
a woman is the glory of the man
God created woman as a help fit for man - Gen. 2:18-24

Christ said that the woman came from the man - 11:8

the man did not originally come from the woman the man was the original source of the woman the woman was taken from the rib of man - Gen. 2:21-22

Christ said that the woman was created for the man - 11:9

the man was not created for the woman the woman was created for the man the man needed woman to be complete - Gen. 2:18, 20-22

3. God gave women and men different roles - 11:10-12

Christ said a woman is to have authority on her head - 11:10

the woman was given a symbol of authority on her head the woman was given this because of the angels the early women used a veil as a symbol of this authority - Gen. 24:64-65

Christ said men and women need each other - 11:11

we are to especially desire to prophesy

Christ says that tongues do not help people grow - 14:2

a person who speaks in a tongue speaks to God
anything spoken in a tongue is not understood by men - I Cor. 14:16

4) a tongue must have interpretation - 14:12-17

every spiritual gift is to build up the church - 14:12

we are to be zealous for spiritual gifts
spiritual gifts are to be understood by Christians - I Cor. 12:1
we are to use our gifts to build up the church
spiritual gifts are given for us to serve one another - I Pet. 4:7-11
spiritual gifts are given to help every Christian mature - Eph. 4:11-13

every tongue should be interpreted - 14:13

a person may speak in a tongue

Paul was gifted by God to share the Word in various countries - Rom. 16:19 Paul could communicate even when he did not understand - Acts 14:11-15

Paul said five words with understanding will teach - 14:19

Paul wanted to speak even five words that could be understood

Paul said that prophesying is what is needed for those who believe - I Cor. 14:22 (Prophesying is speaking the written Word of God)

Paul said that prophesying is needed for edification - I Cor. 14:3

Paul wanted to teach others whenever he spoke to the church

Paul wanted to edify the church when he spoke - I Cor. 14:4

Paul wanted to bring Christians to maturity when he spoke - Col. 1:28-29

Paul felt that was more important than 10,000 words not understood (10,000 words is the amount in a two hour sermon)

Paul wanted to see the power of God at work - I Cor. 1:23-25

Paul became a servant to others so that they could understand - I Cor. 9:19-22

Paul said we are to be mature in our understanding - 14:20

Paul said not to be toddlers in our understanding

a toddler is limited in his understanding - I Cor. 13:11 a toddler acts like one who is not even a Christian - I Cor. 3:1-3 a toddler is unstable and easily deceived - Eph. 4:14 a toddler is dull of hearing and needs to be retaught - Heb. 5:11-14

Paul said in our malice to be like newborn infants

a newborn Christian has a desire for the milk of the Word - I Pet. 2:2 a newborn has things revealed to him by God - Matt. 11:25 a newborn shows a simple childlike faith - Mark 10:15

Paul said in our understanding to be mature

those who are mature desire spiritual wisdom - I Cor. 2:6 those who are mature have a great desire to know Christ - Phil. 3:10-15 those who are mature are equipped for every good work - II Tim. 3:16-17 those who are mature want to help others mature - Eph. 4:11-13

- c. tongues are a sign to unbelieving Jews 14:21-25

God spoke to the Jews in other languages and they did not believe - 14:21 this was predicted by Isaiah and Jeremiah - Is. 28:11-12, Jer. 5:15 this need for a sign by the Jews was confirmed by Paul - I Cor. 1:22 God said that other languages are a sign to unbelieving Jews - 14:22 the Jews experienced confusion when they heard other languages - Acts 2:2-6 the Jews heard the wonderful works of God in their own tongues - Acts 2:7-12

2) prophesying is superior for others - 14:23

speaking in tongues will cause people to mock - Acts 2:13 prophesying will cause people to be convicted - I Cor. 14:24-25

3) prophesying will convict unbelievers - 14:24-25

the Word of God will convict unbelievers - 14:24

the Word of God is to be spoken by all

we are to speak the things which become sound doctrine - Titus 2:1
we are to speak to one another from the Word of God - Col. 3:16

(the early church patterned their services after the synagogue services) the synagogue services had 7 to 9 men read from the Old Testament - Luke 4:16 some may share a doctrine

Paul and Barnabas were asked to share in the teaching - Acts 13:14-43
Paul began in the synagogue if a city had a synagogue - Acts 14:1, 17:1-4, 17:10-12
some may share in another language

this could be done with certain limitations - I Cor. 14:27-28

some may share a revelation

Paul had learned the teaching from Christ by revelation - Gal. 1:12
Paul received the Pauline Epistles by revelation - Eph. 3:3
these things are now included in the New Testament - II Pet. 1:19-21
some may share an interpretation

some have the ability to interpret another language - I Cor. 12:10, 14:27-28 all things are to be done to edify

we are to focus on the things that edify - Rom. 14:19 we are to seek to edify the church - I Cor. 14:12

b. all tongues must be interpreted - 14:27-28

a person who speaks in a tongue must have it interpreted - 14:27

conditions for speaking in another language:
each service is to have a maximum of three speak in another language
too many would tire rather than edify - I Cor. 14:26
each person is to have his message interpreted
some have been gifted to interpret - I Cor. 14:26

a person without an interpreter is to keep silent in the church - 14:28

When there is no interpreter:
a person who speaks another language is to keep quiet
the others will not be able to understand - I Cor. 14:14-16
a person is to speak only to himself and to God
the others would not be edified - I Cor. 14:17

c. all prophesy is to be done in order - 14:29-33

prophesying may be shared by two or three - 14:29

two of three people may explain the Word

these people are to who instruct from the Word of God - I Cor. 14:3 these people are to speak one at a time - I Cor. 14:31

the rest are to examine what they say

the Jewish Christians questioned what Peter said - Acts 11:2 the Jewish Christians accepted the answer of Peter - Acts 11:12-18 this gives us an example of what it means to examine what is said - Rom. 15:4

prophesying is effective when we learn from each other - 14:30

the Holy Spirit may reveal different things to different people - I Cor. 2:9-12

the one who is speaking should become quiet and let another speak
the Holy Spirit gives different gifts for speaking - I Cor. 12:8

prophesying is to be does to help all learn - 14:31

all Christians may speak the Word of God

we have been given our spiritual gifts to profit the body - I Cor. 12:4-7 we are to use our gifts to minister to one another - I Pet. 4:10-11 all Christians are to learn from the Word of God

we speak the Word of God to minister to one another - I Cor. 14:3 we are not to quench the Spirit by despising prophesying - I Thess. 5:19-20 all Christians are to be comforted by the Word of God

prophesying should bring peace and not confusion - 14:33

God is not the author of confusion

the wisdom from above produces peace - Jam. 4:15-18

God is the source for true teaching in all the churches

d. all is to be done in submission - 14:34-35

women are to let the men prophesy in meetings of the whole church - 14:34

the women are to keep silence in the public services

the women bring glory to God by recognizing His headship - I Cor. 10:31-11:3 the women are to learn in silence - I Tim. 2:11-15

the women are not permitted to speak in the public services

this is part of recognizing God's headship - I Cor. 11:3

the women are to be submissive

the women are to be a model of submission - Eph. 5:22-24 the women are to model this submission in public services - I Tim. 2:11 the women model respect when they are submissive - Eph. 5:33 the women model trust in God when they are submissive - I Pet. 3:5-6

the women are actually called to recognize the law

the man is held accountable for sin by God - Rom. 5:12 the man was given accountability in the garden - Gen. 3:16

women are to ask their husbands their questions - 14:35

the women are to have a desire to learn

the wives are to become faithful in all things as they mature - I Tim. 3:11 the women are to become able to teach other women - Titus 2:2-5

the women are to ask their husbands questions at home this helps the husband learn also as they are heirs together - I Pet. 3:7 this helps the husbands learn to love their wives - Eph. 5:25-26

the women are to recognize it is shameful to speak in the services the women are to learn in silence with all subjection - I Tim. 2:11-12 the women are to do what they do to please the Lord - Col. 3:17, 23

e. all of us are to recognize the commandments of the Lord - 14:36-38

the Lord is the source of the Word of God - 14:36

did the Word of God come from man originally?

the Word of God comes from God who spoke through men - II Pet. 1:19-21 did the Word of God come only to a certain group?

we see that the Word of God is for every group - Matt. 28:19-20

the Lord is the One who has given us commandments - 14:37

we show our spiritual maturity when we recognize the Word of God this maturity is the result of choosing to be obedient - I Thess. 4:1-8 we show our spiritual maturity when we realize Paul wrote God's commands this maturity will cause us to recognize Christ gave Paul authority - II Cor. 10:7-11

- A. the teaching about the importance of the resurrection 15:1-11
 - 1. the resurrection is the basis for the Gospel 15:1-2
 - Paul preached the Gospel in which we all stand 15:1

Paul is going to give us a summary of the Gospel he preached this Gospel will be summarized in verses 3 through 11

Paul said that this is the Gospel the people had received this was the Gospel received from the first day on - Acts 2:41

Paul said that that this is the Gospel in which we stand we are able to stand because of God's grace - Rom. 5:1-2

Paul said we are to hold fast what we have received - 15:2

this is the Gospel that saved us

the Lord continues to add to the church those who are being saved - Acts 2:47

this is the Gospel that was preached

the Lord wants this Gospel preached to every creature - Col. 1:23 this is the Gospel we believe if we do not believe in vain the Lord wants us to truly receive this message - II Cor. 6:1-2

2. the resurrection fulfills the Scriptures - 15:3-4

Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures - 15:3

Paul delivered what he had himself received
Paul had received the Gospel by direct revelation - Gal. 1:11-12
Paul said the Gospel is that Christ died according to the Scriptures
Christ became sin for us - II Cor. 5:21
Christ suffered as the just for the unjust - I Pet. 3:18

Christ rose again the third day according to the Scriptures - 15:4

Paul said that the Gospel includes the evidence that Christ was buried Christ was laid in the tomb and was there three days - Acts 13:29-30 Paul said the Gospel is that Christ rose according to the Scriptures Christ was raised from the dead by the Father - Heb. 13:20

3. the resurrection had more than 500 witnesses - 15:5-7

the Lord was seen by the twelve - 15:5

Peter was a witness of the resurrection

the Lord appeared to Peter before the others - Luke 24:34 the Lord personally restored Peter - John 21:15-17

the twelve were witnesses of the resurrection

the Lord appeared to the twelve the first evening after his resurrection - John 20:19-23

the Lord appeared to the twelve again one week later - John 20:24-29 the Lord appeared to seven by the Sea of Galilee - John 21:1-25 the Lord appeared to the twelve on the mountain in Galilee - Matt. 28:16-20 the Lord appeared to the twelve when He returned to heaven - Acts 1:4-11 the Lord chose the twelve to be witnesses of the resurrection - Acts 1:21-26

the Lord was seen by more than 500 people - 15:6

more than 500 people were witnesses of the resurrection
Christ appeared to many in Galilee - Matt. 28:10, Mark 16:7
most of these 500 people were still alive when Corinthians was written
many of the 120 were still alive and sharing the Gospel - Acts 1:15
the disciples were continually sharing the news in Jerusalem - Luke 24:52-53
some of the 500 had already died by the time Corinthians was written
some of the Christians had already died - I Cor. 15:18

the Lord was seen of certain other apostles - 15:7

the Lord was seen by James

this would be James, the brother of Christ, who became the leader of the church at Jerusalem - Acts 15:13-21

this is the James who wrote the book of James - James 1:1

(James, the brother of John, had already died - Acts 12:2)

the Lord was seen by all of the apostles

the apostles saw Christ over a period of forty days - Acts 1:2-3
the apostles were to be witnesses of the resurrection - Acts 1:21-22
the apostles said they were witnesses of the resurrection - Acts 2:32
the apostles made that the basis of their ministry - Acts 4:10-13
the apostles said they could not keep quiet - Acts 4:20
the apostles prayed and spoke with boldness - Acts 4:29-31
the apostles said they would continue give witness - Acts 5:29-32

4. the resurrection was witnessed by Paul - 15:8-11

Paul also saw Christ after the resurrection - 15:8

Paul told how the Lord had appeared to him

the Lord appeared to Paul on the road to Damascus - Acts 9:3-6
this appearance was confirmed by Ananias - Acts 9:17
the Lord taught Paul in the desert - Gal. 1:11-12
the Lord appeared to Paul in Jerusalem - Acts 22:17-21
the Lord was seen by Paul when he was stoned - II Cor. 12:2-6
the Lord appeared to Paul in a vision in Corinth - Acts 18:9

Paul said he was born out of due time

Paul had seen Christ differently than the other apostles - I Tim. 1:12-13

Paul viewed himself as the least of the apostles - 15:9

Paul felt he was the least of the apostles

Paul said that he was the least of all the apostles - Eph. 3:7-8

Paul felt he was not fit to be an apostle

Paul had even killed Christians - Acts 22:4-5, 26:9-11

Paul said that he had persecuted the church

Paul led the persecution of the church - Acts 8:1-3

Paul was saved by the grace of God - 15:10

Paul said he had been saved by the grace of God
Paul says we are all saved by grace - Rom. 11:5-6
Paul said that this grace was not in vain
Paul had obtained mercy in spite of his past - I Tim. 1:15-16
Paul said that he labored even more
Paul had labored and suffered in many ways - II Cor. 11:23-30
Paul said that this was through the grace of God
Paul depended on the Lord working in Him - Col. 1:28-29

Paul and the others preached the resurrection - 15:11

Paul and the others preached the death and resurrection
Paul said that was his only message - I Cor. 2:2
Paul said that the people had believed this preaching
Paul said this was the message they had received - I Cor. 15:1-4

the message of the resurrection was what Paul preached
Paul said his message was the resurrection - I Cor. 15:4
the message of the resurrection was denied by some
Paul said that some felt the resurrection was not credible - Acts 26:8

some were actually teaching that Christ was not raised - 15:13

some taught that there was no resurrection

this actually denies that Christ is the resurrection and the life - John 11:25-26
this teaching actually came from the Sadducees - Acts 23:8
such teaching would mean Christ was not raised
this would actually mean the Spirit is not working in us - Rom. 8:11

2. if there is no resurrection, our faith is vain - 15:14-18 without the resurrection we have an empty faith - 15:14

without the resurrection, preaching is worthless
Paul said that this is the message that he preached - I Cor. 15:2-4
without the resurrection, faith is worthless
Paul said this is the message in which we stand - I Cor. 15:1

without the resurrection we are false witnesses - 15:15

Paul and others would be false witnesses if there was no resurrection
this was the message of David - Acts 2:25-28, 32
this was the message of the apostles - Acts 4:10, 33
this was the message of Peter to the Gentiles - Acts 10:39-43
this was the message of Barnabas and Paul - Acts 13:30-37

Paul and the others would be making false claims without the resurrection
without the resurrection Christ would still be dead - I Cor. 15:13

Paul said that God would not be true if the dead were not raised
God has given victory over death through Christ - I Cor. 15:55-57
God promises us resurrection through Christ - I Thess. 4:13-18

without the resurrection Christ would not be raised - 15:16

the result for Christ if there is no resurrection

Christ would still be dead as the religious leaders tried to claim - Matt. 28:11-15 these religious leaders realized they could not deny the resurrection - Acts 4:10-17

Christ would not have been raised from the dead without resurrection Christ would not be raised - I Cor. 15:13

without the resurrection we are still in our sins - 15:17

the results for us if there is no resurrection

we would be the most miserable people - I Cor. 15:19 our faith would be vain

without resurrection our faith would be vain - I Cor. 15:14

we would still be in our sins

we would die in our sins - John 8:21-24
we would not have forgiveness of sins - Acts 5:31
we would have no way to be justified - Acts 13:38-39
we would have no way to be reconciled to God - Rom. 5:10
we would be separated from the love of Christ - Rom. 8:33-39

without the resurrection those who have died have perished - 15:18

the result for those who have already died
they would still be dead in trespasses and sin - Eph. 2:1
they would have perished and would have no future
there would be no hope - I Thess. 4:13
there would be no return of Christ for the dead - I Thess. 4:14-18

3. if there is no resurrection, we are miserable - 15:19

the result would be hope only for this life

this is why people live only for today - I Cor. 15:32 this is why people do not prepare for the future - Luke 12:16-21 we would lack any down payment on eternal life - Eph. 1:13-14 there would be no basis for our election by God - I Thess. 1:3-4 the result, we would be the most miserable of all

5. Christ give us a purpose to share the Gospel - 15:34

we are to awake to righteousness

it is time for us to awake out of sleep - Rom. 13:11 it is time to awake so Christ can give us light - Eph. 5:14

we are not to sin

Christ calls us to go and sin no more - John 8:11

we are to realize that some do not have the knowledge of God

a grain of wheat must die in order to produce a harvest - John 12:24 Christ had to die before He could enter into His glory - Luke 24:25-26

people do not plant what will be the harvest - 15:37

the seed must change and grow before there is a harvest - Mark 4:26-29

people need to realize that God is the one who gives the body - 15:38

God caused each thing to produce after its kind - Gen. 1:11-12 God is the One who causes all things to develop - I Cor. 3:7

2. every body must have a different kind of glory - 15:39-41

people and animals each have a different kind of life - 15:39

God caused all forms of life to produce after their own kind - Gen. 1:20-26

heavenly and earthly bodies are different - 15:40

the heavenly bodies declare the glory of God - Psalm 19:1 the bodies of people are created in the image of God - Gen. 1:26

even each heavenly body is different - 15:41

God created each of the heavenly bodies by His hand - Psalm 8:3 God created each heavenly body to give a different kind of praise - Psalm 148:3-5 3. every body will be raised as a new body - 15:42-45 the new body will no longer be subject to corruption - 15:42

the resurrection has totally changed the form of new life

the body we have is a body that began with dishonor this body carries on the results of sin - Rom. 5:12 the body that we will have will be raised in glory the new body will be raised a glorious body - Phil. 3:20-21 the body that we have is a body begun with weakness this body has had its days cut short - Psalm 102.23 the body that we will have will be raised in power the new body will live by the power of God - II Cor. 13:4

the new body will be a spiritual body - 15:44

the body that we now have was sown a natural body
this body has experienced all the consequences of sin - Gen. 3:16-19

the first man was from the earth and was dust

2. our new bodies will be incorruptible - 15:53-54

the Lord describes the change that will happen

this corruptible body will become incorruptible
this body will become like the body of Christ - I John 3:2

A. Paul gave instructions regarding offerings - 16:1-4

we are given instructions about giving - 16:1

these instructions are about giving to the saints

Paul often shared gifts from the saints with others - Acts 11:28-30, Acts 24:17 these instructions were given to all of the churches

Paul shared about the giving from the churches of Macedonia - II Cor. 8:1-8 Paul gave detailed instructions to the Corinthians - II Cor. 8:1-9:15

we are to give as God has prospered us - 16:2

we are to give to the Lord on a regular basis

Christians are to give as we meet for worship on Sunday - Acts 20:7 we are to set aside what we will give to the Lord

Christians are to purpose in our hearts what to give - II Cor. 9:7-8

we are to give as the Lord has prospered us

Christians are to share with those in need - II Cor. 8:12-15

we are to give as we receive and not hold back

Christians are to give so that out gifts are available when needed - II Cor. 9:3-5

we are to have faithful people handle our gifts - 16:3

we are to choose people to handle what we give

the church needs to choose faithful men to handle what is given - Acts 6:1-3 we are to choose people to distribute what we give the church needs to choose trusted representatives - II Cor. 8:18-24

the church needs to choose trusted representatives - II Cor. 8:18-24 the church sent trusted representatives with Titus - II Cor. 8:16-19

we are to give so that we can share with others - 16:4

we see Paul might go with those who were going to distribute

Paul did go with them to bring gifts to Jerusalem - Acts 24:17 Paul carried gifts from Macedonia and Achaia - Rom. 15:25-26

we see that those who took the gifts would travel with Paul

Paul had a group of men travel with him to Jerusalem - Acts 21:8

Paul took with him those who had been chosen by the churches - II Cor. 8:19
Paul lists some of those who traveled with him - Acts 20:4-6, 13

B. Paul gave instructions regarding a planned visit - 16:5-9

Paul was planning to visit the Corinthians - 16:5

this visit was already being planned

Paul was planning another visit to Corinth - Acts 19:21-22

this visit would happen after he visited Macedonia

Paul stopped in Macedonia on his way to Corinth - Acts 20:1

this visit would also provide a visit to Macedonia

Paul was hoping to spend the winter with them - 16:6

Paul wanted to spend time with them

Paul had a great concern for the Corinthians - I Cor. 4:14-17

Paul hoped to spend the winter with them

Paul desired to have a couple of visits with them - II Cor. 1:16

Paul knew that they would send him on his way

Paul thanked the Corinthians for helping him in the past - II Cor. 1:8-11

Paul wanted to come when he could stay for a longer period - 16:7

Paul did not want to have just a quick visit
Paul always had a desire to visit the Corinthians - Acts 18:21
Paul wanted to stay with them for a while
Paul did not know when others might try to kill him - Acts 20:3

Paul was planning to stay at Ephesus until Pentecost - 16:8

Paul was planning to spend more time in Ephesus
Paul felt the need to spend more time in Ephesus - Acts 19:21-22
Paul hoped to stay in Ephesus until Pentecost
Paul had his schedule determined by the uproar - Acts 20:1-2

Paul was experiencing an open door for the Gospel - 16:9

Paul had a great and effective door opened to him in Ephesus
Paul was seeing the Lord work mightily in Ephesus - Acts 19:8-10, 18-20
Paul was also experiencing many adversaries in Ephesus
Paul experienced much opposition from the old religion - Acts 19:23-41
Paul warned that there are many enemies of Christ - Phil. 3:18-19

C. Paul gave instructions regarding standing firm in love - 16:10-14

Paul shared about the work of Timothy - 16:10

Timothy might come and they were not to make him fear
Timothy was one who needed encouragement not to fear - II Tim. 1:7

Timothy was doing the work of the Lord

Timothy was a faithful fellow-worker with Paul - Phil. 2:19-22

Paul told them to help Timothy - 16:11

Timothy was not to be despised
Timothy was not to be despised for his youth - I Tim. 4:12
Timothy was to be helped on his journey
we are to help fellow Christians in their ministry - III John 1:6

Paul shared with them about Apollos - 16:12

Paul had urged Apollos to come and visit them
Apollos previously had a great ministry in Corinth - Acts 18:24-28
Paul said Apollos was unwilling to come at that time
Apollos probably did not want to stir up wrong attitudes - I Cor. 1:12, 3:5-6
Paul said Apollos would come later
Apollos ministered in many different places - Acts 18:24-28, Titus 3:13

Paul encouraged them to stand firm - 16:13

Paul encouraged them to watch
we need to also be vigilant in our prayer - Col. 4:2
Paul encouraged them to stand fast in the faith
we also stand by faith - II Cor. 1:24
Paul encouraged them to be brave
we also need to be brave as we speak for Christ - I Tim. 6:12
Paul encouraged them to be strong
we also need to be strong and of good courage - Josh. 1:6-9

Paul encouraged them to do all things in love - 16:14

we are commanded to love one another - John 13:34-35 we are to follow the example of Christ in loving others - I John 4:7-11 we see that the people in Corinth needed to learn to love - I Cor. 13:1-13

D. Paul gave instructions regarding submission - 16:15-18

Paul shared with them about the ministry of Stephanas - 16:15

Paul urged them to consider the ministry of the family of Stephanas we see that they ministered on behalf of the church at Corinth - I Cor. 16:17 we see that they had personally ministered to Paul - I Cor. 16:18 we see that Epaphroditus had a similar ministry - Phil 2:25-30

Paul said his family were among the first to trust Christ in Achaia we see this by the fact that Paul baptized them - I Cor. 1:16

Paul said this family had devoted themselves to ministry to the saints we need to follow the examples of those who have helped others - Rom. 16:1-2

Paul encouraged them to submit to Stephanas - 16:16

we need to submit to those who serve us in prayer - Col. 4:12-13
we need to submit to all those helping in the work of the Lord
we are to submit to those serving the Lord by leading - Heb. 13:17
we are to submit to provide spiritual oversight - I Pet. 5:1-5
we are to submit to those who teach us - I Cor. 4:16-17
we need to submit to al those who are laboring for Christ
we are all to be submissive to one another - I Pet. 5:5

Paul shared how Stephanas had ministered on their behalf - 16:17

Stephanas and others had come to visit Paul
Paul needed encouragement just like we do - II Cor. 7:6
Stephanas and the others had served Paul on behalf of the church
Paul had needs that needed ministry just like we do - Phil. 2:25

Paul told how he had been refreshed by Stephanas - 16:18

Stephanas and the others had refreshed Paul's spirit
Paul knew that we all need to be refreshed - II Cor. 7:6-7
Paul appreciated the ministry of others to him - Phil. 4:18
Stephanas and the others had refreshed the spirit of the church
Paul sent many people to encourage the churches - Col. 4:7-8
Stephanas and the others should be recognized for their efforts
Paul often encouraged churches to recognize others - Phil 2:29

E. Paul gave final greetings - 16:19-24

Paul sends greetings from the churches of Asia - 16:19

Greetings were sent from the churches in Asia

the ministry in Asia began through the ministry of Aquila and Priscilla - Acts 18:18-28

Greetings were sent from Aquila and Priscilla

the church in Corinth also started in their home - Acts 18:2

Greetings were sent from the church in their house

later they also established a church in their house in Rome - Rom. 16:3-5

Paul sends greetings from the brethren - 16:20

Greetings were sent from all the brethren

Paul often included greetings from other churches - Rom. 16:16

Greetings can include a holy kiss

Paul mentioned this as a common form of greeting - II Cor. 13:12

Paul sent personal greetings - 16:21

Paul talked about those who do not love the Lord - 16:22

Paul warns about those who do not love the Lord

people do not love the Lord when they love themselves - II Tim. 3:1-3 people do not love the Lord when they love pleasures - II Tim. 3:4-8 people do not love the Lord when they love money - I Tim. 6:10 people do not love the Lord when they love the world - I John 2:15-17

Paul said that those who do not love the Lord are accursed

those who preach another Gospel are accursed - Gal. 1:8-9 those who are accursed face everlasting judgment - II Thess. 1:5-10 those will be judged for their ungodly deeds - Jude 1:14-15

Paul expressed his desire that they would experience grace - 16:23

Paul always desired that Christians would experience grace - Rom 16:20, 24

Paul expressed his personal love for them - 16:24

Paul wanted his love to be with them - II Cor. 12:15 Paul expressed his love for them - I Cor. 4:14-15
