Peter was an apostle

apostles were witnesses of the resurrection - Acts 1:21-22 **Peter had been appointed an apostle by Christ**Christ chose the twelve to be apostles - Luke 6:13

2. the book was written to the saints in various areas - 1:1b

this book was written to pilgrims
this book was written to pilgrims in Pontus
this book was written to pilgrims in Galatia
this book was written to pilgrims in Cappadocia
this book was written to pilgrims in Asia
this book was written to pilgrims in Bithynia

3. the book was written to people with a relationship with God - 1:2

they were elect according to the foreknowledge of God

God chose us before the foundation of the world - Eph. 1:4; Col. 3:12 we were foreordained before the foundation of the world - I Pet. 1:20 they were sanctified by the Holy Spirit

the Holy Spirit set us apart through sanctification - II Thess. 2:13 they were set apart from sin to serve Christ

Christ set us apart and empowers each of us to serve - Eph. 4:15-16 Christ set us free to serve the living God - Heb. 9:14

they were saved through the sprinkling of the blood of Christ without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness - Heb. 9:22

they were to experience the grace and peace of God

we were shown grace to receive salvation - Eph. 2:8-9 we grow in grace through Christ - II Pet. 3:18

we experience peace as we bring our requests to God - Phil. 4:4-7 we experience peace as we transform our thoughts - Phil. 4:8-9

God is the one who is Blessed
the Father is blessed and He blessed us - Eph. 1:3
God is the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ
the Father is well pleased with His Son - Matt. 17:5
God is the One that has shown abundant mercy
God saved us by His mercy - Titus 3:5
God has begotten us again to a living hope
we are born of God - John 1:13
this is a spiritual birth - John 3:5-7; 3:14-17
God has done this by raising Christ from the dead
God raised Christ from the dead - Acts 4:10

2. God has promised us an eternal inheritance - 1:4

we are joint heirs with Christ - Rom. 8:17
we have been given the Holy Spirit as the down payment - Eph. 1:13-14
God says this inheritance is incorruptible
treasure in heaven does not corrupt - Matt. 6:19-21
God says this inheritance is undefiled
God is making all things new - Rev. 21:5
God says this inheritance does not fade away
the world and its works will be burned - II Pet. 3:10
God says this inheritance is reserved in heaven for us
Christ is preparing a place for us - John 14:3

3. God keeps us by His power - 1:5

God says we are kept by the power of God
nothing can separate us from the love of God - Rom. 8:31-39
God has done this through faith
God drew us to Christ and Christ saved us - John 6:37; Eph. 2:8-9
God has done this for our salvation
there is salvation in no one else - Acts 4:9-12
God will reveal this salvation fully in the last time
Christ will be revealed when He comes for us - Col. 3:4

we rejoice because of the promises that have been given to us
we have been given exceedingly precious promises - II Pet. 1:4
we can rejoice even when when we are grieving
God comforts us in all of our tribulation - II Cor. 1:3-4
we can rejoice even when experiencing many trials
we know that Christ has overcome the world - John 16:33

2. we know that our faith is being tested for approval - 1:7

the genuineness of our faith is very precious
the genuineness of our faith is shown by trials
we are able to count it all joy when we have trials - James 1:2
the genuineness of our faith will be praised when Christ comes
we will be blameless when Christ comes for us - I Cor. 1:7-8
the genuineness of our faith will be honored when Christ comes
Christ wants us to be vessels of honor when He comes - II Tim. 2:20-21
the genuineness of our faith will receive glory when Christ comes
we will receive the crown of life when He comes - James 1:12

we love Christ although we have not yet seen Him
we are walking by faith and not by sight - II Cor. 5:7
we do not yet see Christ
we are looking for the appearing of Christ - Titus 2:13

we rejoice with joy inexpressible
we have joy that no one can take from us - John 16:22

we will see the completion of our faith
we will be like Him when we see Him - I John 3:2
we will see the salvation of our souls
there is no condemnation for those in Christ - Rom. 8:1

1. the prophets wanted to know about this salvation - 1:10

the Old Testament saints saw these promises afar off - Heb. 11:13
the prophets searched diligently to learn about this salvation
the prophets received witness through faith - Heb. 11:39-40
the prophets spoke of the grace that would come to us
the prophets promised salvation by grace - Is. 55:1-7

2. the prophets wanted to understand the death and resurrection - 1:11

the prophets spent time to search and try to learn
the prophets wrote even though they did not understand - II Pet. 1:19-21
the prophets wanted to know what the Spirit was telling them
Isaiah wanted to understand what the Spirit taught him - Is. 59:21
the prophets told about the sufferings of Christ
Isaiah 53 is a great illustration of a prophecy of Christ's sufferings
Christ taught what Moses and all the prophets said about Him - Luke 24:45-48
the prophets told about the glory that would follow
Isaiah 55 tells of the plan of God to provide salvation
Isaiah spoke of both the first and second coming of Christ - Is. 61:1-11
Isaiah even spoke of the new heavens and the new earth - Is. 64:17

3. the prophets realized they were ministering to us - 1:12

the prophets realized they were not speaking for themselves
Daniel was told to shut up the things he was writing - Daniel 12:4
the prophets learned that they were speaking for us
Daniel learned that what he wrote was sealed for later - Daniel 12:8-9
the prophets have their teaching revealed by those who teach
the sermon of Peter in Acts 2 quotes many Old Testament passages
Paul said that he declared the whole counsel of God - Acts 20:27
the prophets have their ministry explained through the Holy Spirit
the Holy Spirit is the One that teaches us all things - John 14:26
we speak the things that the Holy Spirit teaches us - I Cor. 2:13
we are given the mind of Christ through the Holy Spirit - I Cor. 2:16
the prophets even caused the angels to want to learn
these things have now been revealed to the angels - Eph. 3:10

1. we are to prepare our minds for the coming of Christ - 1:13

we are to prepare our minds for action

"gird up" was a phrase meaning to get ready for action

we are to be sober minded

we are to be alert in our thoughts - I Thess. 5:6, 8

we are to rest our hope fully on grace

the return of Christ is our blessed hope - Titus 2:13

we will have that grace brought to completion

we will be like Christ when we see Him - I John 3:1-2

this will happen at the time Christ is revealed

this will happen when Christ comes for the church - I Thess. 4:13-18

2. we are to change our actions as we wait for His coming - 1:14

we are to be obedient children

we are to walk in the Spirit and be led by the Spirit - Gal. 5:16, 18
we are not to continue walking the way we used to walk
we are not to practice the works of the flesh - Gal. 5:19-21
we are not to walk the way we walked in our ignorance
we formerly had our understanding darkened - Eph 4:18
God calls men to repent from this ignorance - Acts 17:30

3. we have been called to live a holy life - 1:15

the One that has called us is holy
we are to be followers of God - Matt. 5:48; Eph. 5:1
we are called to be holy in all of our conduct
we are to be an example of the believers - I Tim. 4:12

4. we are to follow the example of Christ - 1:16

Christ calls us to be holy

we can only walk together if we are in agreement - Amos 3:3

Christ gave us the perfect example of holiness

Christ is without sin - I Pet. 2:21-24

B. We have a godly fear - 1:17-21

1. we know the Father will judge our works - 1:17

we call God our Father
we know that God judges without partiality
we know that God will judge everyone's work
we will all stand before the judgment seat of Christ - II Cor. 5:10
we are to live our lives with godly fear
godly fear causes us to be ready to share our hope - I Pet. 3:15

2. we have not been redeemed by corruptible things - 1:18

we were not redeemed by corruptible things we were not redeemed by silver or gold we were redeemed from our aimless conduct we had this conduct passed on to us by tradition

3. we have been redeemed by the blood of Christ - 1:19

we were redeemed by the precious blood of Christ we have redemption through the blood of Christ - Eph. 1:7 we know Christ was a lamb without blemish or spot Christ was without spot or blemish - Heb. 9:14

4. we believe the One that was revealed to us - 1:20

Christ planned to redeem us before the world was created we were chosen to be in Him before the creation - Eph. 1:4

Christ was revealed to us in these last times

God spoke to us in these last days through His Son - Heb. 1:2

5. we believe the One that God raised from the dead - 1:21

we believe in God through Christ
we come to the Father through Christ - John 14:6
we believe God raised Christ from the dead and gave Him glory
we believe that God raised Christ from the dead - Rom. 10:9
we have our faith and hope in God
we can draw near because of this faith and hope - Heb. 10:22-23

C. We have a fervent love - 1:22-25

1. we are to love one another with a pure heart - 1:22

we have purified our souls

we have yielded ourselves to righteousness - Rom. 6:16-17

we are able to obey the truth through the Spirit

we are able to obey because God is working in us - Phil. 2:12-13

we are to have a sincere love for the brethren

we are to love our brothers and sisters in Christ - I Pet. 2:17

we are to love one another fervently

we are to love as Christ loved us - John 13:34-35

we are to love one another with a pure heart

we are to serve one another in love - Gal. 5:13

2. we have been born again by the Word of God - 1:23

we have been born again

Christ told Nicodemus that he must be born again - John 3:3

this did not happen through corruptible seed but through incorruptible

Christ told him he needed both a physical and spiritual birth - John 3:5-7

we were born again through the Word of God

faith comes by hearing the Word of God - Rom. 10:17

we know that the Word of God lives and abides forever

God says His words will not pass away - Matt. 24:35

3. we know that those with physical life will die - 1:24

physical life is temporary just like the grass
all flesh is like grass and withers and fades - Is. 40:6-7
the glory of man passes away like the grass
both rich and poor pass away just like the grass - James 1:10-11
physical life ends just like the grass

4. we know that those with spiritual life will live forever - 1:25

the Word of the Lord endures forever
the Word of the Lord shall stand forever - Is. 40:8
this is the Word that was preached to us
the Gospel was preached and we were saved by it - I Cor. 15:1-8

- 1. we choose to lay aside certain things 2:1-3
 - a. there are things that we lay aside 2:1

we are to lay aside all malice

malice is evil that comes from within - Titus 3:3

we are to lay aside all deceit

Christ did not have any deceit in His mouth - I Pet. 2:22 we are to avoid words of deceit - I Pet. 3:10

we are to lay aside hypocrisy

hypocrisy is always a characteristic of false teachers - I Tim. 4:2 Christians can also practice hypocrisy - Gal. 2:11-14

we are to lay aside envy

the religious leaders delivered up Christ because of envy - Matt. 27:18 envy is one of the results of pride - I Tim. 6:3-4

we are to lay aside all evil speaking

evil speaking is speaking against one another - II Cor. 12:20

b. there is one thing that helps us grow - 2:2

we are to be like newborn babes

this is a baby that has just been born

we are to desire the pure milk of the Word

milk is used to describe basic spiritual teachings - Heb. 5:12-13 spiritual milk must come before spiritual solid food - I Cor. 3:2

we are to grow through the Word

the Word of God is living and powerful - Heb. 4:12 the Word of God can bring us to spiritual maturity - II Tim. 3:16-17

c. there is the knowledge that Christ is gracious - 2:3

this is to be true of all that are Christians

we realize that we are saved by grace - Eph. 2:8-9

we have experienced what the Lord has provided

Christ tasted death for every person - Heb. 2:9

we have learned that the Lord is gracious

we learn that the grace of the Lord is sufficient - II Cor. 12:9 we are to be kind or gracious as a result - Eph. 4:32

- 2. we choose to come to the Living Stone 2:4-6
- a. we realize that Christ is the Living Stone 2:4

we are to come to Christ and remain with Him
we are to abide in Christ - John 15:5
we come to Christ as to a living stone
Christ is the great massive rock - Matt. 16:18
we know that Christ was rejected by men
Christ was rejected of men - Is. 53:3
we know that Christ was chosen by God
the Father chose Christ to pay for our sins - II Cor. 5:21
we know that Christ is precious
Christ redeemed us with His precious blood - I Pet. 1:19

b. we realize that we are also living stones - 2:5

we are also living stones
Christ lives in us - Gal. 2:20
we are built up a spiritual house
we are a part of the household of God - Eph. 2:19
we are to called to be a holy priesthood
God said to be holy because He is holy - I Pet. 1:16
we are to offer up spiritual sacrifices
we do not have to offer blood sacrifices - Heb. 9:7
we offer our lives to Christ for His service - Rom. 12:1
these sacrifices will be acceptable to God through Christ
such sacrifices bring glory to God - I Pet. 4:11

c. we know Christ is the chief cornerstone - 2:6

the Scriptures spoke of Christ in the Old Testament
this verse is a quotation of Isaiah 28:16
God said He would lay a Chief Cornerstone in Zion
Christ is the Chief Cornerstone - Eph. 2:20
God said that this Chief Cornerstone would be precious
Christ is chosen of God and is precious - I Pet. 2:4
God said those who believe that One will not be ashamed
the hope we have in Christ does not make us ashamed - Rom. 5:5
those who believe in Christ will not be ashamed - Rom. 10:11

3. we choose to proclaim the praises of Him that called us - 2:7-10

a. Christ is the head of the corner to the church - 2:7

Christ is precious to those who believe
Christ is the stone that the builder rejected
the Lord caused the builders to reject this stone - Ps. 118:22-23
Christ has become the Chief Cornerstone

b. Christ is a stone of stumbling to those who reject - 2:8

Christ is a Stone of stumbling to those who reject Christ is a Rock of Offence to those who reject those who stumble are disobedient to the Word we are to be doers of the Word - James 1:22 those who stumble are appointed to judgment they have made the choice to follow Satan - John 16:11

c. Christ has called us to show forth His praises - 2:9

we are a chosen generation

we have been chosen to salvation - I Pet. 1:2
we are a royal priesthood

God had originally called Israel to be a kingdom of priests - Ex. 19:6 we are now called a kingdom of priests and will rule with Him - Rev. 5:10 we are His own special people

Christ chose us to be a people of His own - Titus 2:14

we are able to speak of the praises of Him

we are to share the Gospel with every creature - Mark 16:15

we have been called out of darkness into His marvelous light

Christ is the light of the world - John 8:12

d. Christ has called us to be the people of God - 2:10

we were not a people we are now the people of God

Jews and Gentiles were made one in Christ - Eph. 3:13-18

we had not obtained mercy we have now obtained mercy

Christ saved us by His mercy - Titus 3:5

1. we choose to live godly lives in the world - 2:11-12

a, we are to abstain from fleshly lusts - 2:11

we are to recognize that we are sojourners
our citizenship is in heaven - Phil. 3:20
we are to realize that we are pilgrims
we are strangers and pilgrims on earth - Heb. 11:13
we are to abstain from fleshly lusts
fleshly lusts control us through sin - Rom. 7:14
we know that fleshly lusts war against the soul
fleshly lusts cause mental anguish - Rom. 7:14-25

b. we are to practice good works - 2:12

we are to have our conduct honorable among the Gentiles
we are to be holy in all of our conduct - I Pet. 1:15
we realize that they may call us evildoers
the world may call us evil when we do good - Acts 16:18-21
we are to lives godly lives which they can observe
we are to be rich in good works - I Tim. 6:18
we will see some glorify God in the day of visitation
we are to let our lights shine before men - Matt. 5:16

2. we choose to submit to the laws of governments - 2:13-17

a. we are to submit to government authorities - 2:13

we are to submit to every ordinance of man
we are to submit for conscience sake - Rom. 13:5
we submit because we are servants of Christ - Eph. 6:6
we are to do this for the Lord's sake
we do everything that we do for the Lord's sake - Col. 3:17
we are to submit to the king or other supreme ruler
we are to be subject to the higher powers - Rom. 13:1
we are to pray for those in authority - I Tim. 2:2

b. we are to recognize the role of governments - 2:14

we are to submit to governors

the principle of government was established by God - Rom. 13:1

we are to recognize that they serve to punish evildoers

rulers are given by God to execute wrath - Rom. 13:4

we are to recognize that they praise those who do good

rulers praise those that do what is good - Rom. 13:3

c. we are to do the will of God - 2:15

we are to do the will of God

we are not to live for the flesh but for the will of God - I Pet. 4:2

we are to do good

we are to do good to all people - Gal. 6:10

we will put the evil to silence by doing good

we will silence the evil by doing good - Titus 2:8

d. we use our freedom as servants of God - 2:16

we have been given liberty

we have been given liberty and set free - Gal. 5:1

we are not to use our liberty for sin

we are not to use our liberty to offend another - I Cor. 10:29

we are given liberty to serve one another in love - Gal. 5:13

we are to use our liberty as bondservants of God

where the Spirit of the Lord is there is liberty - II Cor. 3:17

e. we honor and love others - 2:17

we are to honor all people

Christ gave the example by honoring the Father - John 8:49 we begin by learning to honor our parents - Eph. 6:2

we are to love the brotherhood

we are to love as brothers - I Pet. 3:8, 4:8

we are to fear God

we are all to fear God - Rom. 11:20

servants are to fear God - Col. 3:22

we are to honor our rulers

we are to fear and honor our rulers - Prov. 24:21

B. We submit as servants (employees) - 2:18-20

1, servants are to be submissive to their masters - 2:18 servants are to be submissive to their masters

servants are to do this with all fear
servants are to serve their masters with fear - Eph. 6:5
servants are to do this if their masters are good and gentle
Christian masters are to be good and gentle - Eph. 6:9
servants are also to do this if their masters are harsh
such servants will be rewarded by the Lord - Col. 3:24

2. servants are to have a clear conscience before God - 2:19

servants are to seek what pleases God
servants are to serve to please the Lord - Eph. 6:7
servants are to do this heartily as to the Lord - Col. 3:23
we are to do all to the glory of God - I Cor. 10:31
servants are to have a clear conscience before God
servant are to focus on doing the will of God - Eph. 6:6
servants are to be willing to endure grief
servants are to serve with singleness of heart - Col. 3:22
servants are to be willing to suffer wrongfully
servants may be accused falsely - Matt. 5:11
Joseph gave us an example when he suffered wrongfully - Gen. 39:7-21

3. servants are to do good when they suffer - 2:20

servants will suffer when they do wrong
servants will suffer for doing wrong - Col. 3:25
servants are to take such suffering patiently
servants are to do the will of God from the heart - Eph.. 6:6
servants may do good and still suffer
we are to behave ourselves in all things - II Cor. 1:12
servants are to take it patiently when they suffer for doing good
we are not to return evil for evil - I Pet. 3:9
servants will please God when they suffer with patience
Christ gave us an example of suffering with patience - Phil. 2:5-8
Christ gave us an example to follow in His steps - I Pet. 2:21

1. Christ gave us an example to follow - 2:21

Christ calls us to be willing to suffer

we can be happy when we suffer for righteousness - I Pet. 3:14

Christ can do this because He suffered for us

Christ suffered as the just for the unjust - I Pet. 3:18

Christ left us an example by His suffering

we will suffer persecution as we live godly - II Tim. 3:12

Christ wants us to follow His example when we suffer

Christ gave us an example of serving - John 13:15

Christ gave us an example of suffering - I Pet. 2:23

2. Christ did not commit sin - 2:22

Christ did not commit sin when He suffered

Christ held His peace before the religious leaders - Matt. 26:63 even Pilate said Christ was without fault - John 19:6

Christ did not speak with deceit when He suffered this was prophesied by Isaiah the prophet - Is. 53:9

3. Christ chose to commit Himself to the Father - 2:23

Christ was reviled when He suffered

Christ was reviled by false witnesses - Matt. 26:59-61 Christ was reviled by the soldiers of Pilate - John 19:1-3 Christ did not revile in return

Christ did not answer when the false witnesses accused Him - Matt. 26:62
Jesus did not answer Pilate after the Jews accused Him - John 19:9
Christ did not return railing for railing - I Pet. 3:9

Christ did not threaten when He suffered

Christ answered nothing when He was accused - Mark 15:3-5 Christ was led as a lamb to the slaughter - Is. 53:7

Christ committed Himself to the Father

Christ told Pilate that Pilate had no power in himself - John 19:11 Christ commended His spirit to the Father - Luke 23:46

Christ knows that the Father judges righteously

Christ chose the will of the Father - Matt. 26:39 the Lord is the righteous judge - II Tim. 4:8

4. Christ bore our sins on the cross - 2:24

Christ, Himself, bore our sins

Christ came as the Lamb of God - John 1:29 Christ gave Himself for us - Titus 2:14 Christ became sin for us - II Cor. 5:21

Christ bore our sins in His body

Christ because our substitute by shedding His own blood - Heb. 9:12 Christ was offered to bear the sins of many - Heb. 9:28

Christ bore our sins on the the cross

Christ was hanged on a tree for us - Acts 5:30 Christ was slain and hanged on a tree - Acts 10:39 Christ became a curse for us - Gal. 3:13

Christ did this so that now we have died to sins

our old man was crucified with Him - Rom. 6:9 Christ died so we can do the will of God - I Pet. 4:1-2

Christ did this so we could live for righteousness

we are now able to yield our lives as instruments of righteousness - Rom. 6:13 we are now able to share the message of reconciliation - II Cor. 5:19

Christ healed us by His stripes

quoted from Isaiah 53:5 we are healed from the disease of sin - Luke 4:18

5. Christ is the Shepherd and Overseer of our souls - 2:25

we were like sheep going astray

we have all gone astray like sheep - Is. 53:6 Christ said that people are like scattered sheep - Matt. 9:36 Christ is concerned to look for the sheep - Matt. 18:12; Luke 15:4

3. we are to show hospitality to one another - 4:9

we are to be hospitable to one another

we are to use our homes as places to minister - Rom. 16:3-5 we are even to be hospitable to strangers - Heb. 13:1-2 we are to show hospitality without grumbling we are not to complain about one another - James 5:9

4. we are to use our gifts to serve one another - 4:10

we have all received a gift or gifts

the Holy Spirit gives us different gifts - I Cor. 12:4-7
the Holy Spirit gave these gifts according to His will - I Cor. 12:11
we are to use our gifts to serve one another

judgment begins in the household of God

Peter was an eyewitness of both Christ's sufferings and majesty - II Pet. 1:16
Peter said they would share the glory that will be revealed
Peter knew a little of what that glory was like - Matt. 17:1-8

2. the elders are to lead willingly - 5:2

the elders are to shepherd the flock of God

the word "pastors" in Eph. 4:11 is translated shepherds in every other passage
Christ told the disciples to shepherd His sheep - John 21:16

the elders are to take the oversight of the flock of God
oversight includes feeding the church of God - Acts 20:28

oversight includes guarding the flock from false teachers - Acts 20:29-31

the elders are to lead willingly and not by compulsion
spiritual leaders are called by God - I Cor. 9:16

the elders are not to lead for dishonest gain
the elders are to seek the eternal inheritance - Acts 20:32
false teachers look for dishonest gain - II Peter 2:1-3

3. the elders are to lead by example - 5:3

the elders are not to lord it over the flock of God
those who lord it over others have wrong motives - III John 9-10
godly leaders are to be servants of all - Mark 10:42-45
the elders are to lead the flock of God by example
we are to follow the example of Christ - Phil. 2:5-8
we are to be able to invite people to imitate us - I Cor. 11:1
Timothy was told to be an example to the believers - I Tim. 4:12

4. the elders can look forward to rewards - 5:4

they will face the judgment of all who reject - Phil. 3:19 **false teachers speak evil about things they do not understand**an evil person brings out the evil in his heart - Luke 6:43-45 **false teachers will perish in their own corruption**they become the servants of their own corruption- II Pet. 2:19

they tell people what they want to hear - II Tim. 4:3-4

false teachers have gone astray
they deceive others and they deceive themselves - II Tim. 3:13

false teachers follow the way of Balaam
Balaam was told that God had blessed Israel - Num. 22:12

Balaam loved the wages of unrighteousness
Balaam was after the money he was offered - Num. 22:13-21

Balaam was rebuked by his donkey
the donkey tried to stop Balaam and then spoke to him - Num. 22:22-30

Balaam had his madness stopped by a donkey
Balaam was protected from death by the donkey - Num. 22:31-35

we become equipped for every good work - II Tim. 3:17

Peter wanted them to remember the words of the prophets
they spoke these words by the will of God - II Pet. 1:21
the Word of God helps us to grow in wisdom - Ps. 119:97-100

Peter wanted them to remember the words of the apostles
Peter said that the epistles were also scripture - II Pet. 3:16

Peter said that they were the apostles of the Lord and Savior
God confirmed the message of the apostles by signs - Heb. 2:3-4

3) Peter said there would be scoffers who would come - 3:3

Peter said that there would certainly be scoffers
Paul also warned of such scoffers - II Tim. 3:1-8
Peter said that these would come in the last days
the apostles warned that scoffers would come in the last days - Jude 17-18
scoffers will find that destruction will come suddenly - I Thess. 5:3
Peter said the scoffers would walk according to their own lusts
Christ said that people do the lusts of their father - John 8:44
scoffers do not want to retain God in their knowledge - Rom. 1:28
scoffers take pleasure in getting others to join them in evil - Rom. 1:32

b. Peter said people would not believe in the return of Christ - 3:4-7

1) scoffers would say things continue as they always have - 3:4

they will reject the promises of God

Christ promised to come back for the Christians - I Cor. 15:51-52

they will say that things are no different than in the time of their fathers
they try to predict the future by the past and forget what God says - Heb. 9:27

they will say things have been the same ever since creation
they will be caught unprepared - I Thess. 5:3

2) scoffers would choose to forget God's judgments in the past - 3:5-6

they make a choice to forget the past

they forget that God created the earth - Gen. 1:1-9
they forget that God later judged the earth - Gen. 6:5-7; 7:21-22
they forget what is recorded in the Word of God
these things were written for our learning - Rom. 15:4
they forget what the Word teaches about the flood
all except Noah and the others in the ark died - Gen. 7:21-22
they forget that the rebellious all perished
the flood came and took them all away - Matt. 24:37-39
they forget that God promised not to destroy again by flood
God said He would not judge by water again - Gen. 9:11

3) scoffers do not expect judgment to come - 3:7

they forget the heavens and earth that we have now will be judged
that judgment will affect both man and the creation - Rev. 20:13-21:1
they forget these are being preserved by the word of Christ
Christ is the One who holds all things together - Col. 1:17
the Lord is the One that is longsuffering - II Pet. 3:9
the Lord will find many unprepared when He comes - Matt. 25:12-13
the Lord will send fire out of heaven to destroy when He judges - Rev. 20:9-11
they forget the world will one day be judged by fire
Christ will one day take vengeance with flaming fire - II Thess. 1:7-8
Christ said that the Holy Spirit will one day baptize with fire - Matt. 3:11-12
they forget that both the earth and the people will be judged
the Lord will judge the earth with fire - Micah 1:3-4
the Lord will burn the unbelieving with fire - Mal. 4:1

IV. The Reminder of future coming events - 3:8-18

A. The Lord is demonstrating His patience - 3:8-9

1. God measures time differently than people - 3:8

Peter did not want Christians to forget

Peter had a great love for the Christians - I Pet. 2:11; 4:12 Peter had written a second time because of this love - II Pet. 3:1 Peter wanted them to have peace because of this love - II Pet. 3:14

Peter wanted us to know that God counts time differently

God has an eternal focus from everlasting to everlasting - Ps. 90:2

Peter knew that God can slow down time

the Lord waited 100 years instead of 40 days to judge Nineveh - Jonah 3:4 the Lord saw the repentance of Nineveh - Jonah 3:5-7 the Lord chose to show mercy to that generation - Jonah 3:10; 4:11

Peter knew that God can speed up time

a thousand years is nothing in the sight of God - Ps. 90:4

2. God wants all to come to repentance - 3:9

the Lord is not late in keeping His promise

the Lord came at the time He had planned - Gal. 4:4 the Lord has an appointed time for all things - Heb. 9:27

the Lord is not controlled by the time predictions of people

no one knows the time of His coming - Matt. 24:42-44

the Lord is patient and longsuffering

Moses reminded the Lord that He is longsuffering - Num. 14:18 love is patient or longsuffering - I Cor. 13:4

the Lord is not willing for any to perish

Christ wants all to come to Him - Matt. 11:28

Christ did not come to condemn the world - John 3:17

Christ will receive all that come to Him - John 6:37

Christ came so that we could have life - John 10:10

Christ offers life to all who believe - John 11:25-26

Christ is the way to come to the Father - John 14:6

the Lord is waiting for all to come to repentance

Christ said the message of repentance should be given to all - Luke 24:46

Christ gave an invitation to all to believe - John 3:16

the last invitation of God is to come - Rev. 22:17

B. The Lord defines the day of the Lord 3:10-12

1. the Lord tells what His judgment will be like - 3:10

the Day of the Lord will certainly come

the Day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night
the Day of the Lord will come without warning - I Thess. 5:2-3
the Day of the Lord will see the heavens pass away
the heavens will be dissolved - Is 34:4
the Day of the Lord will see the elements melt with great heat
these will be judged by fire - II Pet. 3:7
the Day of the Lord will see the earth burned up
these things will all be dissolved - II Pet. 3:12
the Day of the Lord will see the works of the earth burned up
the works of believers on this earth will be tested by fire - I Cor. 3:12-16
the works of unbelievers lead to eternal judgment - Rev. 20:12-15

2. the Lord tells what we should be like - 3:11

we know that all of these things are going to happen
Christians are not ignorant about the Day of the Lord - I Thess. 5:2

we need to be examining our own lives

people are told to examine their own lives - I Cor. 11:28; II Cor. 13:5

we need to practice holy conduct

we are to have a good life led by godly wisdom - Jam. 3:13

we need to practice godliness

God has given us the power to live in godliness - II Pet. 1:3

3. the Lord tells us what will happen to this earth - 3:12

we can look forward to the day of God
God is going to deliver His creation from corruption - Rom. 8:19-22
God will create a new heaven and a new earth - Rev. 21:1
we know that the heavens will be dissolved
the heavens will be dissolved - Is. 34:4
we know that the heavens will be on fire
God will judge the present creation with fire - II Pet. 3:7
we know that the elements will melt with fervent heat
God will melt with a burning heat - Is. 64:1-2

C. The Lord says that we have a great future - 3:13-14

1. we look for new heavens and a new earth - 3:13

the Lord has given us a promise

God gave a promise of a new heavens and earth to Isaiah - Is. 65:17 the Lord will make a new heaven and a new earth - Rev. 21:1

the Lord says we can look for new heavens

the Lord said the new heavens would remain - Is. 66:22

the Lord says we can look for a new earth

the earth we have now will be judged - II Pet. 3:7

the Lord says that there will be righteousness

the new heavens and earth will be righteous - Rev. 21:1-7

2. we want to be blameless when we meet Christ - 3:14

we are to be looking forward to these things
we will see the former thing pass away - Rev. 21:3-4
we can look forward to all things being new - Rev. 21:5
we are to be diligent to be found by Christ in peace
we can experience the peace of God right now - Phil. 4:7-9
we are to be diligent to be without spot
our desire should be to know Christ - Phil. 3:10
we are to be renewing our inner man daily - II Cor. 4:16
we are to be diligent to be blameless
we want to be blameless in the day of Christ - I Cor. 1:8
we are to be blameless and harmless - Phil. 2:15
Paul wanted to present all Christians blameless - Col. 1:22
we want our hearts to be unblameable in holiness - I Thess. 3:13
we want to be blameless when Christ comes - I Thess. 5:23

D. The Lord says the Word is not always easy to understand - 3:15-16

1. Peter said that Paul wrote from the wisdom given to him - 3:15

Paul had written according to the wisdom given to him
Paul had been taught by the Lord in Arabia - Gal. 1:15-17
Paul had written to all who became Christians
Paul wrote to help Christians and churches mature - Eph. 4:11-16
Paul wanted every Christian to be complete - II Tim. 3:16-17

2. Peter said Paul wrote some things hard to understand - 3:16

Paul shared that wisdom in all of his epistles

Paul shared these things so the Holy Spirit can teach us - I Cor. 2:12

Paul spoke some things that are hard to understand

God will reveal these things through His Spirit - I Cor. 2:10

Paul had some of his teachings twisted by untaught people

some learn but never come to the knowledge of the truth - II Tim. 3:7

Paul had some of his teachings twisted by unstable people

unstable people are deceived by false teachers - II Pet. 2:14

Paul had his teachings twisted by those facing destruction

the natural man cannot receive the things of God - I Cor. 2:14

these people also twisted all of the other Scriptures

Peter warned that there would be false teachers - II Pet. 2:1

E. The Lord wants us to continue to grow - 3:17-18

1. Christians are to make sure that they are not deceived - 3:17

Peter says that believers have known these things
believers have the Holy Spirit to teach them - I Cor. 2:13
Peter says that believers also need to beware
Christians that think they stand can fall - I Cor. 10:12
Peter says that even believers can be led away and deceived
weak Christians are easily deceived - Eph. 4:14
Peter says that believers can fall from their own steadfastness
we are to be steadfast and unmovable - I Cor. 15:58

2. Christians are to grow in grace - 3:18

believers are to grow in grace

we grow through the milk of the Word - I Pet. 2:2
we grow through the solid food of the Word - Heb. 5:14
believers are to grow in the knowledge of Christ
we are to take root in Christ - Col. 2:6-7
we are to take root in the love of Christ - Eph. 3:17-19
believers are to give glory to Christ right now
we are to do all to the glory of God now - I Cor. 10:31
believers are to give glory to Christ forever
we are to seek the glory of Christ forever - Eph. 3:20-21
