Paul viewed himself as a bondservant of Jesus Christ - 1:1

Paul viewed himself as a bondservant of Christ

Paul often called himself a bondservant of Christ - Phil. 1:1; Titus 1:1 Paul also viewed himself as a bondservant of the church - II Cor. 4:5

Paul had been called by Christ to be an apostle

Paul had been made an apostle by grace - Rom. 1:5 Paul had been given the signs of an apostle - II Cor. 12:11-12

Paul had been set apart to the Gospel

Paul had been set apart by the Holy Spirit - Acts 13:2-4 Paul had been taught directly by the Lord - Gal. 1:15-17

Paul said his message was taught in the prophets - 1:2

Paul said that the prophets taught about Christ

Christ had taught two disciples what the Old Testament taught - Luke 24:26-27 Christ taught the eleven what the Old Testament taught - Luke 24:44-45 Paul said the fathers taught about Christ - Acts 26:6

Paul said that the prophets taught about the Gospel

Paul said the Gospel had been proclaimed by the prophets - Rom. 3:21

Paul said that this teaching was in the Word of God

Peter said that this promise came from the Lord - II Pet. 1:16-21

Paul said that Christ came from the family of David - 1:3

Paul said the Scriptures taught Christ is the Son of God this was a promise that Christ would be born of a virgin - Is. 7:14 this was a promise that He would be the Mighty God - Is. 9:6-7

Paul said the Scriptures taught Christ was a descendent of David

this was a promise that God made to David - II Sam. 7:12-13 this promise was that the seed of David would rule forever - Ps. 89:36-37 this promise was that God would send a Branch of righteousness - Jer. 23:5-6 this promise was to raise up the tabernacle of David - Amos 9:11

Paul said that Christ is declared to be the Son of God with power - 1:4

Christ was declared to be the Son of God with power

God declared that Christ was His Son - Acts 13:34-35 Christ said He would fulfill the writings of the prophets - Luke 18:31-33 God confirmed His prophetic word about Christ - II Pet. 1:16-21

Christ was declared this according to the Spirit of holiness Christ offered Himself through the eternal Spirit - Heb. 9:14

Christ demonstrated this power by His resurrection

God demonstrated this power by raising Christ from the dead - Eph. 1:19-23 Christ now lives by the power of God - II Cor. 13:4

Paul said that Christ gave him grace and apostleship - 1:5

Paul had received grace through Christ

this grace was given to Paul - Rom. 12:3; Rom. 15:15-16 this grace caused Paul to become what he was - I Cor. 15:10 this grace means our sufficiency is from God - II Cor. 3:5 this grace was revealed in the timing of God - Gal. 1:15-16

Paul had received his apostleship through Christ

Paul said that he was a true apostle - I Cor. 9:2-3

Paul said he was recognized as an apostle to the Gentiles - Gal. 2:8-9

Paul was called to proclaim obedience through faith among all nations

Paul had been sent to the nations - Rom. 15:18-20

Paul said that his message was for all the nations - Rom. 16:26

Paul said that the Romans had been called by Christ - 1:6

the Romans had also been called

God is the One who called, justified and glorified - Rom. 8:28-30 God is the One who calls both Jews and Gentiles - Rom. 9:24 **the Romans had been called of Jesus Christ**Christians are all called by Christ - I Pet. 2:9

Paul said the Romans were called to be saints - 1:7

this letter was to all the beloved in Rome this letter was to all who had been called saints

Paul pointed out other churches were also called saints - I Cor. 1:2
this letter assured them that grace and peace came from the Father
this letter assured them that grace and peace came from Christ

this faith caused thanksgiving in Paul

the Romans went from slaves to sin to obedient to Christ - Rom. 6:17

this faith was spoken of throughout the Roman world
the obedience of the Romans had become known to all - Rom. 16:19.

b. Paul said that he prayed for the Romans without ceasing - 1:9

Paul said God was a witness to his words

Paul wanted a clear conscience before God - Rom. 9:1

Paul served God with his spirit in sharing the Gospel of His Son

Paul served the Lord wherever the Lord led him - Acts 19:21

Paul said God was a witness to his prayer life

Paul prayed without ceasing for many others - II Tim. 1:3

Paul said that God was his witness that he prayed without ceasing for them

Paul prayed for saints in all parts of the world - Eph. 1:16-19; 3:14-21

c. Paul was praying for the opportunity to visit the Romans - 1:10

Paul was praying for the opportunity to visit Rome - Rom. 15:24 Paul was praying that he would have a good trip to Rome - Rom. 15:30-32 Paul was praying for God to lead him in God's timing - Acts 16:6-7; 19:8-10

Paul would not speak of anything he had not done - Rom. 15:18

Paul had been given fruit in many other places

Paul had preached over a wide area - Rom. 15:19

Paul was a debtor to the Greeks

Paul was a debtor to go wherever God sent him - Acts 13:2-4 Paul had been sent to the Gentiles - Acts 9:15; 22:21; 26:17 Paul preached to both the Jews and the Greeks - Acts 20:20-21

Paul was a debtor to the barbarians

Paul was a debtor to those who were without law - I Cor. 9:21

Paul was a debtor to the wise

Paul was concerned for those who had human wisdom - I Cor. 9:20-22
Paul wanted Christians to have godly wisdom - Rom. 16:19
Paul wanted Christians to have the wisdom from above - James 3:17-18

Paul was a debtor to the unwise

Paul was concerned for those who lacked wisdom - I Cor. 14:23-24

h. Paul said he was ready to preach the Gospel in Rome - 1:15

Paul said that he was ready to come to Rome

Paul had long desired to visit Rome - Rom. 1:13
Paul wanted to visit Rome on his way to Spain - Rom. 15:24
Paul planned to visit Spain after going to Jerusalem - Rom. 15:25-29

Paul said he was always ready to preach the Gospel

Paul did not want to build on the foundation of another - Rom. 15:20-21 Paul wanted to go where the Gospel had not been preached - II Cor. 10:15-16

Paul said he was ready to preach the gospel in Rome

Paul asked them to pray that he would reach Rome - Rom. 15:30-32

Paul did not know how the Lord would bring him to Rome - Acts 25:10-12

Paul was sent to Rome as a prisoner by Festus - Acts 26:32-27:1

Paul arrived in Rome according to the plan of God - Acts 28:16

Paul fulfilled the Word of the Lord given years earlier - Acts 9:15-16

a. The message of Paul was the Gospel - 1:16a

Paul was not ashamed of the Gospel

his message was always about Christ - I Cor. 2:2
his concern was to take this message to all places - Rom. 16:24-27

Paul said his message was the Gospel of Christ
his message was the death and resurrection of Christ - I Cor. 15:1-6

b. The message of Paul was a message of power - 1:16b

Paul shared a message that proclaimed the power of God this message turns people from darkness to light - II Cor. 4:3-6

Paul proclaimed a message that provided salvation this message provides forgiveness and eternal life - Acts 26:18

c. The message of Paul is for all people - 1:16c

This message provides salvation to all who believe
this salvation is for all who believe - Rom. 10:13
this salvation is received by grace through faith - Eph. 2:8-9
This message was first given to the Jews
this message was first proclaimed to the Jews - Acts 2:5-41
this message was often rejected by the Jews - Acts 13:44-46
This message is also to be given to the Greeks (Gentiles)
this message is to be shared with every ethnic group - Matt. 28:19-20
the plan of God includes people of every kindred - Rev. 5:9

d. The message of Paul shows the righteousness of God - 1:17

The message of the Gospel reveals the righteousness of God
that righteousness can only come from God - Rom. 3:10-23
that righteousness works effectively in all who believe - I Thess. 2:13
The message of the Gospel must be received by faith
that righteousness must be received by faith - Gal. 3:10-12
that righteousness is received through faith in Christ - Phil. 3:9
The message of the Gospel makes it possible for the just to live by faith
the just will only live by faith - Heb. 10:38
that faith is absolutely necessary in order to please God - Heb. 11:6-7

mankind changed that glory into images of man
men made images of man to worship - Is. 44:13
mankind changed that glory into images of birds
mankind changed that glory into animals
men worshiped animals instead of God - Ps. 106:20
mankind changed that glory into creeping things
men began to worship creeping things - Ezek. 8:10
men chose to worship idols - I Cor. 12:2
men worshiped the works of their own hands - Rev. 9:20

uncleanness is one of the things we are to put to death - Col. 3:5
uncleanness is the result of blindness of the heart - Eph. 4:18-19

man was given up to follow the lust of his own heart
the heart is deceitful and desperately wicked - Jer. 17:9
the heart was darkened when man turned away from God - Rom. 1:21
the evil heart is the source of evil speech - Matt. 12:34-35

man was given up to dishonor his own body

men received in themselves the penalty of their error

the men of Sodom were judged for their sin - Gen. 19:24-25 the men of Gibeah were judged for their sin - Judg. 20:13; 20:37

men will receive the penalty of their error

this penalty is promised to all who reject - I Cor. 6:9-10
this penalty can be avoided by repentance - I Cor. 6:11
this penalty came on the men of Sodom - Jude 7
this penalty will come on all the ungodly - Jude 15-16
this penalty will be paid in the lake of fire and brimstone - Rev. 20:13-15
this penalty will be eternal - Rev. 21:8

we are to judge ourselves so we will not be judged - I Cor. 11:31

b. those who are judged will be judged according to truth - 2:2

we can be sure that God will judge

God will judge those who walk in pride - Dan. 4:37
God will bring His justice to light - Zeph. 3:5
God will judge the world in righteousness - Acts 17:31
God will judge the living and the dead - II Tim. 4:1
God is the righteous judge of both good and evil - II Tim. 4:8
God is the judge who stands before the door - James 5:9

b. man makes one of two responses to the law - 2:13

those who hear the law cannot be justified
those who hear the law and do not obey forget what they are - James 1:22-24
those who obey the law shall be justified
those who hear and obey will be blessed - James 1:25

c. man may not have the law in written form - 2:14

the Gentiles do not have the law
the law was given to the Jews - Rom. 3:1-2
the Gentiles by nature do the things contained in the law
the Gentiles have known about God from His creation - Rom. 1:19-20
the Gentiles have become a law unto themselves
the Gentiles know the judgment of God and still sin - Rom. 1:32

d. man has the law because of his conscience - 2:15

the Gentiles show the work of the law written in their hearts

the Jews had received the commandments at Mt. Sinai - Neh. 9:13-14
the Jews said they approved the things that were excellent
the Jews knew that they had the Scriptures - Rom. 15:4
the Jews said they were instructed out of the law
the Jews had been taught the law of God - Ps. 119:97-100, 105, 130

c. the Jews felt they could lead those in darkness - 2:19

David said God imputes righteousness apart from works

God imputed this righteousness through Christ's obedience - Rom. 5:18-19

Paul had a clear conscience as he spoke

Paul said that he had a clear conscience about his conduct - II Cor. 1:12

Paul said we are all to have a clear conscience - I Tim. 1:5

Paul knew the benefits of an uncondemned heart -I John 3:19-21

2) Paul was filled with sorrow - 9:2

Paul had great heaviness of heart

Paul had a great desire to see Israel saved - Rom. 10:1 Paul wept as he saw those who were enemies of Christ - Phil. 3:18

Paul had continual sorrow of heart

Paul followed the example of Moses - Ex. 32:32

Paul followed the example of David as he wept for others - Ps. 119:36 Paul followed the example of Jeremiah as he wept for Israel - Jer. 9:1; Lam. 3:48-51

3) Paul had a great concern for the Jews - 9:3

Paul had a concern for his brethren like Moses - Acts 7:23-26

b. Paul reviewed the privileges of Israel - 9:4-5

1) Paul spoke of the blessings of the Israelites - 9:4

the Israelites received the adoption

the people of Israel were chosen by God - Gen. 32:28
the people of Israel were called to be a holy nation - Ex. 19:3-6
the people of Israel were chosen as a special treasure above all peoples -Deut. 7:6
the Israelites received the glory

the people saw the glory of the Lord fill the tabernacle - Ex. 40:34-38 the Israelites received the covenants

Paul had a great concern in his heart for Israel

Paul had continual sorrow for the Jews - Rom. 9:1-3
Paul became a Jew to the Jews - I Cor. 9:20-23
Paul prayed to God for Israel

Paul prayed continually for the Jews - Rom. 9:1-2

Paul prayed that Israel might be saved

Paul prayed for the salvation of the Jews - Rom. 9:1-5

2) Paul said that Israel has a zeal for God - 10:2

Paul gave his own testimony about Israel

the Jews like Paul had persecuted Christians - Acts 26:9-11 the Jews knew how Paul had advanced in Judaism - Gal. 1:14 the Jews had seen the zeal of Paul for Judaism - Phil. 3:4-6

Paul said that Israel had a zeal for God

the Jews thought they were serving God by persecuting Christians - John 16:2 the Jews tried to kill Paul for sharing with the Gentiles - Acts 21:28; 22:22

Paul said that zeal was not according to knowledge the Jews had their minds blinded by Satan - II Cor. 4:3-4

3) God says that Israel has not submitted to His righteousness - 10:3

Paul said Israel was ignorant of God's righteousness

the Jews did not receive Christ when He came to them - John 1:10-11 the Jews did not understand that righteousness came by faith - Rom. 1:17 the Jews did not understand that righteousness came through Christ - Rom. 3:22-26 the Jews did not understand that Christ became sin for them - II Cor. 5:21

Paul said Israel went about to establish their own righteousness

the Jews were depending on their works for righteousness - Is. 57:12 the Jews did not understand that our righteousness is unacceptable - Is. 64:6

Paul said Israel did not submit to the righteousness of God the Jews wanted to justify themselves - Luke 10:29; 18:9-14 the Jews tried to justify themselves before men - Luke 16:15 the Jews tried to be justified through the law - Gal. 5:3-4

b. God said that Christ is the One who fulfilled the law - 10:4-7

1) the righteousness of the law was fulfilled by Christ - 10:4

Christ is the end of the law

the Jews could only find righteousness by faith - Rom. 3:28-30 the Jews could not fulfill the righteousness of the law- Rom. 8:3-4 the Jews could find true righteousness in Christ - Col. 2:13-14

Paul says God wants His glory to be known to the vessels of His mercy - Rom. 9:23 Paul has just reminded us that we have obtained mercy from God - Rom. 11:30

Paul urges us to present our bodies as a living sacrifice Paul says we are to present ourselves to God - Rom. 6:13-16

Paul urges us to present our bodies as a holy sacrifice

Paul says we are to present ourselves as slaves to righteousness - Rom. 6:19

Paul urges us to present our bodies as an acceptable sacrifice

Paul reminds us that our bodies are the temple of the Holy Spirit - I Cor. 6:13-20

Paul says this is our reasonable service

Paul wanted to magnify Christ in His body - Phil. 1:20 Paul says we are to renew the inward man day by day - II Cor. 4:16

2. God wants our lives to be transformed - 12:2

Paul urges us not to be conformed to this world

God did not want Israel to follow the abominations of the nations - Deut. 18:9-14

Christ says His followers are not of this world - John 17:14

God says we are to separate ourselves from the things of the world - II Cor. 6:14-18

God says we are not to love the world - I John 2:15-17

Paul urges us to be transformed by the renewing of our minds

Phoebe was to receive help as needed - III John 5-10

Phoebe had been a helper to many including Paul

Phoebe was known like Tabitha for her service - Acts 9:36-41

2) Paul next mentioned Priscilla and Aquila - 16:3-4

Paul sent greetings to Aquila and Priscilla

Paul began the church in Corinth in their home - Acts 18:1-3

Paul said they were fellow workers in Christ

Paul knew how they had ministered in Ephesus - Acts 18:26

Paul said they had also started a church in their house in Asia - I Cor. 16:19

Paul said they risked their necks for his life

Paul was protected by some disciples in Ephesus - Acts 19:30

Paul said all the churches gave thanks for them

Paul knew they had helped many churches

3) Paul sent greetings to the church in their house - 16:5 Paul knew they helped start churches wherever they went

Corinth - Acts 18:1-3 Ephesus - Acts 18:26

Rome - Romans 16:5

4) Paul sent greetings to Epaenetus - 16:5

Epaenetus was one of the first to become a Christian in Asia

b. these greetings were to many other Christians - 16:6-16

1) Paul sent greetings to Mary - 16:6

Mary was one who worked hard to help Paul and his team

2) Paul sent greetings to Andronicus and Junias - 16:7

Andronicus and Junias were relatives of Paul Andronicus and Junias had been fellowprisoners with Paul Andronicus and Junias had been well known by the apostles Andronicus and Junias had become Christians before Paul

- 3) Paul sent greetings to Ampliatus 16:8
 - Ampliatus was beloved in the Lord
- 4) Paul sent greetings to Urbanus 16:9 Urbanus had been a helper in Christ
- 5) Paul sent greetings to Stachys 16:9
 Stachys was beloved in the Lord
- 6) Paul sent greetings to Apelles 16:10
 Apelles was approved in Christ
- 7) Paul sent greetings to the household of Aristobulus 16:10 Aristobulos and his entire household were known by Paul
 - 8) Paul sent greetings to Herodian 16:11 Herodian was also a relative of Paul
 - 9) Paul sent greetings to the household of Narcissus 16:11 Narcissus and the entire household were known by Paul
 - 10) Paul sent greetings to Tryphena and Tryphosa 16:12
 Tryphena and Tryphosa worked hard in the Lord
 11) Paul sent greetings to Persis 16:12

Persis was a beloved brother who labored hard for the Lord

12) Paul sent greetings to Rufus and his mother - 16:13

Rufus was chosen by the Lord and his mother had apparently helped Paul

- 13) Paul sent greetings to Asyncritus, Phlegon, Hermes, Patrobas and Hermas
 Paul greeted these as well as several associated with them
 - 14) Paul sent greetings to Philologus, Julia, Nereus and his sister 16:15
 Paul greets these as well as several associated with them

15) Paul told them to greet each other with a holy kiss - 16:16

greetings are to be with a holy kiss - Rom. 16:16
greetings were given with a holy kiss - I Cor. 16:20, II Cor. 13:12
greetings are to be given to the brethren with a holy kiss - I Thess. 5:26
greetings are to be given with a kiss of love - I Pet. 5:14

- 3. Paul gave a concluding admonition -16:17-27
- a. Paul warned of those who cause divisions 16:17-19
- 1) Paul warned them to avoid those who cause divisions 16:17

Paul told them to note those who cause divisions

Paul encourages us to note how people walk - Phil. 3:17-19
Paul encourages us to note those who do not obey the Word - II Thess. 3:14-15
Paul was very concerned by those who caused divisions - I Cor. 1:10-13; 3:3; 11:18

Paul said those taught contrary to the doctrine they had learned

Paul said some taught a different gospel - Gal. 1:7-9 Paul said some taught to bring people into bondage - Gal. 2:4

Paul said some taught through philosophy and empty deceit - Col. 2:8

Paul said they were to be avoided

Paul said to avoid professing Christians who practice sin - I Cor. 5:9-11 Paul said to avoid professing Christians who walk disorderly - II Thess. 3:6

2) Paul said those who cause divisions serve themselves - 16:18

Paul said those who cause divisions do not serve Christ

Paul says these are seeking their own benefit - Phil. 2:21

Paul said those who cause divisions serve their own belly

Paul says these are enemies of Christ who walk to please themselves - Phil. 3:18-19
Paul says these pretend to be godly for the purpose of self gain - I Tim. 6:5

Paul said they cause divisions by smooth speech

Paul says that such deceivers come as angels of light - II Cor. 11:13-15
Paul says that such people use persuasive words - Col. 2:4

Paul said they cause divisions by flattering words

Paul says these cause division both by words and by actions - II Tim. 3:2-7 Paul says these attract followers who have itching ears - II Tim. 4:3-4

3) Paul said the Romans were known for their obedience - 16:19

Paul said the obedience of the Romans had become known to all

Paul said the faith of the Romans was known throughout the world - Rom. 1:8

Paul said he wanted them to be wise to what is good

God wants us to be mature in our understanding - I Cor.14:20 God wants us to have a spirit of wisdom and understanding - Eph. 1:18-19

Paul said he wanted them to be simple concerning evil

God does not even want us to speak about the evil they do in secret -Eph 5:11-12

b. Paul promised that God would defeat Satan - 16:20

the God of peace will bruise Satan

God promised that the head of Satan would be bruised - Gen. 3:15 God sent Christ to defeat Satan and release those held by him - Heb. 2:14-15 God sent Christ to destroy the works of the devil - I John 3:8

the God of peace will place him under your feet

God said His followers would trample the wicked under their feet - Mal. 4:3 God gave power over all the power of the enemy - Luke 10:19

the God of peace will cause you to experience grace

God says the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ is with us - Rom. 16:24 the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the communion of the Holy Spirit is with us - II Cor. 13:14

1) Paul sent greetings from Timothy - 16:21a

Timothy was from the area of Derbe and Lystra - Acts 16:1
Timothy joined Paul on his second visit to this area - Acts 16:2-3
Timothy was left with Silas to teach at Berea - Acts 17:14
Timothy and Silas rejoined Paul in Corinth - Acts 18:5
Timothy was sent by Paul to Macedonia - Acts 19:22
Timothy was sent by Paul to Corinth - I Cor. 4:17
Timothy is mentioned with Paul in II Corinthians - II Cor. 1:1
Timothy was in prison with Paul when he wrote Philippians - Phil. 1:1
Timothy was left to help the churches in Ephesus - I Tim. 1:2-3
Timothy was commissioned to develop other faithful men - II Tim. 2:2

2) Paul sent greetings from Lucius, Jason and Sosipater - 16:21b

Lucius is another form of Luke

Lucius is the name of a leader of the church at Antioch - Acts 13:1-2 these men are also called countrymen of Paul

3) Paul sent greetings from Tertius - 16:22

Tertius was the secretary who wrote this letter

4) Paul sent greetings from Gaius - 16:23

Gaius was the one in whose home Paul was staying Gaius also had a church meeting in his home

- 5) Paul sent greetings from Erastus 16:23
 Erastus was the city treasurer in Corinth
- 6) Paul sent greetings from Quartus 16:23 Quartus was a brother in Christ who was with Paul

d. Paul gave a concluding benediction - 16:24-27

- 1) Paul wanted the Christians to experience grace 16:24
 Grace was a constant theme with Paul I Thess. 5:20
- 2) Paul said that God had the power to establish them 16:25

God has the power to establish Christians

God is able to make us stand - Rom. 14:4

God is able to build us up and give us an inheritance - Acts 20:32

God is able to do far more than we could ever imagine - Eph. 3:20-21

God is the One who gave Paul the Gospel

God revealed the Gospel to Paul in the desert - Gal. 1:16-18

God is the One who commissioned him to preach Christ

God gave Paul the opportunity to preach immediately - Acts 9:18-20

God called Paul to preach Christ - II Cor. 4:5; Tim. 1:12-15 God is the One who revealed the mystery to Paul

God chose Paul to reveal the mystery - Eph. 3:1-4

God had kept this a secret from the foundation of the world

God had kept this mystery a secret from past ages - Eph. 3:5

God made Jews and Gentiles fellow heirs in Christ - Eph. 3:6-11

3) Paul said that God wanted to bring all nations to obedience of faith - 16:26

God now made this clear through the Scriptures

God called Paul to preach Christ among the Gentiles - Eph. 3:8

God planned for all nations to know this by the Scriptures

God willed to make known the glory of this mystery - Col. 1:26-27 God revealed His righteousness so that all could believe - Rom. 3:21-30

God revealed through the Scriptures He would justify the Gentiles by faith - Gal. 3:8

God gave this as an everlasting commandment

God commanded us to make disciples of all nations -Matt. 28:19-20

God did this for obedience to the faith

God wants to multiply the number of disciples - Acts 6:7

4) Paul gave glory to God through Christ - 16:27

God is the only One with true wisdom

God is the source of all wisdom - Eph. 1:7-8

God is to receive glory through Jesus Christ
